- *A state of mind in which consciousness is fragile and voluntary action is poor or missing; a state resembling deep sleep.*



## Synonyms of "Trance" as a noun (11 Words)

### **brown study**

Scottish botanist who first observed the movement of small particles in fluids now known as Brownian motion (1773-1858).

### **daydream**

Absentminded dreaming while awake.  
*She was lost in a **daydream**.*

### **daze**

A state of stunned confusion or bewilderment.  
*He was walking around in a **daze**.*

### **dream**

A state of mind in which someone is or seems to be unaware of their immediate surroundings.  
*It was a **dream** of a backhand.*

### **enchantment**

The state of being under a spell; magic.  
*A world of mystery and **enchantment**.*

**half-conscious state** A state of depression or agitation.

**haze** A very fine cloud of something such as vapour or smoke in the air.  
*The gathering **haze** of cigarette smoke.*

**hypnotic state** A drug that induces sleep.

**reverie** Absentminded dreaming while awake.  
*A knock on the door broke her **reverie**.*

**spell** A period of indeterminate length (usually short) marked by some action or condition.  
*A **spell** of good weather.*

**stupor** A state of near-unconsciousness or insensibility.  
*A drunken **stupor**.*

## Synonyms of "Trance" as a verb (12 Words)

**becharm** Control by magic spells, as by practicing witchcraft.

**beguile** Attract; cause to be enamored.  
*He **beguiled** the voters with his good looks.*

**bewitch** Attract; cause to be enamored.  
*A handsome prince who had been **bewitched** by a sorceress.*

**captivate** Attract; cause to be enamored.  
*He was **captivated** by her beauty.*

**capture** Capture as if by hunting snaring or trapping.  
*The star **captured** a comet.*

**catch** Catch up with and possibly overtake.  
*She will **catch** hell for this behavior.*

**charm** Protect through supernatural powers or charms.  
*She **charmed** him into giving her all his money.*

**enamor** Attract cause to be enamored.

**enamour** Be filled with love for.

*It is not difficult to see why Edward is **enamoured** of her.*

**enchant** Fill (someone) with great delight; charm.

*The scenery began to **enchant** her.*

**entrance** Attract; cause to be enamored.

**fascinate** Attract; cause to be enamored.

*The snake charmer **fascinates** the cobra.*

- amulet** An ornament or small piece of jewellery thought to give protection against evil, danger, or disease.
- bewitchment** A magical spell.
- [captivate](#)** Attract and hold the interest and attention of; charm.  
*He was **captivated** by her beauty.*
- [charisma](#)** Compelling attractiveness or charm that can inspire devotion in others.  
*He has tremendous **charisma** and stage presence.*
- [charm](#)** Induce into action by using one's charm.  
*A gesticulating figure endeavouring to **charm** a cobra.*



<b><u>enchant</u></b>	Fill (someone) with great delight; charm. <i>Marcia had <b>enchanted</b> the rope so that it simply regenerated when any length was cut off.</i>
<b><u>enthrall</u></b>	Hold spellbound.
<b><u>entrance</u></b>	The coming of an actor or performer on to a stage. <i>Their <b>entrance</b> into the political arena.</i>
<b><u>fascinate</u></b>	Attract; cause to be enamored. <i>I've always been <b>fascinated</b> by computers.</i>
<b>hypnotic</b>	Relating to or producing hypnosis. <i>Her voice had a <b>hypnotic</b> quality.</i>
<b>hypnotist</b>	A person who carries out hypnosis, either for medical reasons or for entertainment. <i>An expert clinician and skilled <b>hypnotist</b>.</i>
<b>hypnotize</b>	Capture the whole attention of (someone); fascinate. <i>She gazed down <b>hypnotized</b> by the swirling tide.</i>
<b>magic</b>	Move change or create by or as if by magic. <i>The <b>magic</b> of the theatre.</i>
<b><u>magical</u></b>	Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers. <i>It was a <b>magical</b> evening of pure nostalgia.</i>
<b><u>magician</u></b>	Someone who performs magic tricks to amuse an audience. <i>He was the <b>magician</b> of the fan belt.</i>
<b>mesmerize</b>	Hypnotize (someone). <i>He was <b>mesmerized</b> when at the point of death.</i>
<b>narcissist</b>	Someone in love with themselves. <i><b>Narcissists</b> who think the world revolves around them.</i>
<b>narcotic</b>	Relating to or denoting narcotics or illegal drugs. <i>The substance has a mild <b>narcotic</b> effect.</i>
<b>necromancer</b>	One who practices magic or sorcery. <i>Dr Faustus a <b>necromancer</b> of the 16th century.</i>
<b>painkiller</b>	A medicine used to relieve pain.
<b><u>paralyzed</u></b>	Affected with paralysis.
<b>relaxant</b>	A thing having a relaxing effect. <i>A <b>relaxant</b> drug.</i>
<b>sedative</b>	A drug that reduces excitability and calms a person. <i>A mild <b>sedative</b>.</i>

*He looked at the **sleeping** child.*
- soporific** Sleepy or drowsy.  
*The motion of the train had a somewhat **soporific** effect.*
- sorcerer** One who practices magic or sorcery.
- spell** Orally recite the letters of or give the spelling of.  
*She **spelled** her husband at the wheel.*
- spellbind** Put into a trance.  
*The singer held the audience **spellbound**.*
- state** The three traditional states of matter are solids fixed shape and volume and liquids fixed volume and shaped by the container and gases filling the container.  
*King Fahd appointed a council to advise him on affairs of **state**.*
- wizard** Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers- Shakespeare.  
*How absolutely **wizard**.*
