
## Trance as a Noun

- A half-conscious state characterized by an absence of response to external stimuli, typically as induced by hypnosis or entered by a medium.
- A psychological state induced by (or as if induced by) a magical incantation.
- A state of mind in which consciousness is fragile and voluntary action is poor or missing; a state resembling deep sleep.

daydream	Absentminded dreaming while awake. <i>She was lost in a <b>daydream</b>.</i>

**half-conscious state** A state of depression or agitation.

<u>reverie</u>	Absentminded dreaming while awake. A knock on the door broke her <b>reverie</b> .
<u>spell</u>	A period of indeterminate length (usually short) marked by some action or condition. A <b>spell</b> of good weather.
<u>stupor</u>	A state of near-unconsciousness or insensibility. A drunken <b>stupor</b> .

- Attract; cause to be enamored.






### Synonyms of "Trance" as a verb (12 Words)
