<b>calm</b>	(of the weather) pleasantly free from wind. <i>Remained <b>calm</b> throughout the uproar.</i>
<b>composed</b>	Serenely self-possessed and free from agitation especially in times of stress. <i>The performer seemed completely <b>composed</b> as she stepped onto the stage.</i>
<b>controlled</b>	(of a drug) restricted by law with respect to use and possession. <i>The country's tightly <b>controlled</b> financial markets.</i>
<b>cool</b>	Inducing the impression of coolness used especially of greens and blues and violets when referring to color. <i>He gave a <b>cool</b> reception to the suggestion for a research centre.</i>
<b>cool, calm, and collected</b>	Neither warm nor very cold; giving relief from heat.

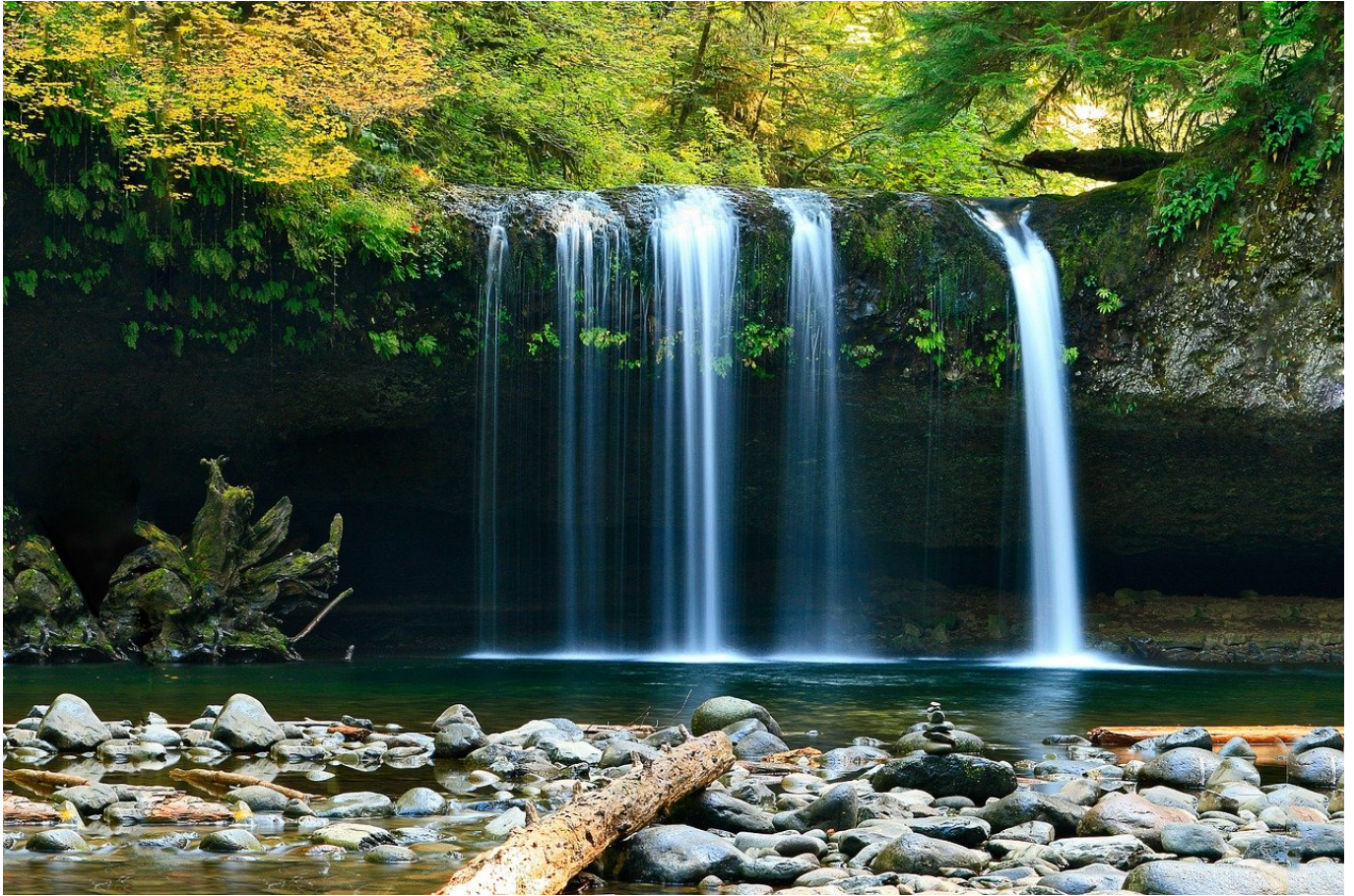
<b>dispassionate</b>	Unaffected by strong emotion or prejudice. <i>She dealt with life's disasters in a calm <b>dispassionate</b> way.</i>
<b>even-tempered</b>	Not easily irritated.
<b>halcyon</b>	Idyllically calm and peaceful; suggesting happy tranquillity. <i>A <b>halcyon</b> atmosphere.</i>
<u><b>idyllic</b></u>	Like an idyll; extremely happy, peaceful, or picturesque. <i>An <b>idyllic</b> spot for a picnic.</i>
<u><b>imperturbable</b></u>	Not easily perturbed or excited or upset; marked by extreme calm and composure. <i>Hitherto <b>imperturbable</b> he now showed signs of alarm.</i>
<u><b>mild</b></u>	Humble in spirit or manner suggesting retiring mildness or even cowed submissiveness. <i>A <b>mild</b> winter storm.</i>
<b>pacific</b>	Disposed to peace or of a peaceful nature. <i>The result of this <b>pacific</b> policy was that no troops were called up.</i>
<b>peaceful</b>	Peacefully resistant in response to injustice. <i>His <b>peaceful</b> mood vanished.</i>
<u><b>placid</b></u>	Free from disturbance by heavy waves. <i>The <b>placid</b> waters of a small lake.</i>
<u><b>pleasant</b></u>	(of a person or their manner) friendly and considerate; likeable. <i>They found him <b>pleasant</b> and cooperative.</i>
<b>quiet</b>	(of the sun) characterized by a low level of surface phenomena, such as sunspots. <i>Clothes in <b>quiet</b> good taste.</i>
<b>relaxed</b>	Free from tension and anxiety. <i>The <b>relaxed</b> atmosphere of the hotel.</i>
<b>relaxing</b>	Affording physical or mental rest. <i>A <b>relaxing</b> massage with aromatherapy oils.</i>
<b>reposeful</b>	Affording physical or mental rest. <i>The desire for <b>reposeful</b> contemplation.</i>
<u><b>restful</b></u>	Affording physical or mental rest. <i>The rooms were cool and <b>restful</b>.</i>
<b>self-possessed</b>	In full control of your faculties.
<u><b>serene</b></u>	Calm, peaceful, and untroubled; tranquil. <i><b>Serene</b> certainty.</i>

<b><u>smooth</u></b>	Without breaks between notes smooth and connected. <i>A lovely <b>smooth</b> very fruity wine.</i>
<b><u>sober</u></b>	Not affected by a chemical substance (especially alcohol). <i>A <b>sober</b> view of life.</i>
<b><u>soothing</u></b>	Affording physical relief. <i>Almond oil is renowned for its <b>soothing</b> properties.</i>
<b>still</b>	Free from disturbance by heavy waves. <i>A <b>still</b> autumn day.</i>
<b>stoical</b>	Enduring pain and hardship without showing one's feelings or complaining. <i>He taught a <b>stoical</b> acceptance of suffering.</i>
<b>unagitated</b>	Not agitated; without losing self-possession.
<b><u>undisturbed</u></b>	Not disturbed. <i>He could pursue his studies <b>undisturbed</b>.</i>
<b><u>unemotional</u></b>	Cool and formal in manner. <i>A flat <b>unemotional</b> voice.</i>
<b>unexcitable</b>	(of a person) not easily excited. <i>An <b>unexcitable</b> temperament.</i>
<b>unflappable</b>	Having or showing calmness in a crisis. <i>Self contained <b>unflappable</b> Glaswegian common sense.</i>
<b>unperturbed</b>	Free from emotional agitation or nervous tension. <i>Kenneth seems <b>unperturbed</b> by the news.</i>
<b>unruffled</b>	(of a body of water) free from disturbance by heavy waves. <i>The <b>unruffled</b> waters of the lake.</i>
<b>untroubled</b>	Not beset by troubles or disturbance or distress. <i>A man <b>untroubled</b> by a guilty conscience.</i>

<b>halcyon</b>	A tropical Asian and African kingfisher with brightly coloured plumage. <i>The <b>halcyon</b> days of the mid 1980s when profits were soaring.</i>
<b><u>hush</u></b>	Wash by removing particles. <i>Management took steps to <b>hush</b> up the dangers.</i>
<b><u>imperturbable</u></b>	Unable to be upset or excited; calm. <i>An <b>imperturbable</b> self possession.</i>
<b>noiseless</b>	Making no sound- Shakespeare. <i>The cycle is a <b>noiseless</b> form of transport.</i>
<b>nonviolence</b>	Peaceful resistance to a government by fasting or refusing to cooperate.
<b>pacific</b>	Relating to or bordering the Pacific Ocean. <i>The <b>pacific</b> temper seeks to settle disputes on grounds of justice rather than by force.</i>
<b>peaceable</b>	Disposed to peace or of a peaceful nature. <i>They met in a <b>peaceable</b> spirit.</i>
<b>peaceful</b>	Peacefully resistant in response to injustice. <i>Everything was so quiet and <b>peaceful</b> in the early morning.</i>
<b><u>placid</u></b>	Calm and peaceful, with little movement or activity. <i>A <b>placid</b> contented man.</i>
<b>quiescent</b>	Being quiet or still or inactive. <i>The <b>quiescent</b> melancholy of the town.</i>
<b>quiet</b>	Become quiet or quieter. <i>I ll have a <b>quiet</b> word with him.</i>
<b>quietude</b>	A state of peace and quiet. <i>It highlights her <b>quietude</b> and wise passivity.</i>
<b><u>restful</u></b>	Affording physical or mental rest. <i>She spent a <b>restful</b> night at home.</i>
<b>reticence</b>	The quality of being reticent; reserve. <i>The traditional emotional <b>reticence</b> of the British.</i>
<b><u>serene</u></b>	An expanse of clear sky or calm sea. <i>Not a cloud obscured the deep <b>serene</b>.</i>
<b><u>serenity</u></b>	The state of being calm, peaceful, and untroubled. <i>An oasis of <b>serenity</b> amidst the bustling city.</i>
<b>silence</b>	Keep from expression, for example by threats or pressure. <i>We finished our meal in <b>silence</b>.</i>
<b><u>static</u></b>	Concerned with or producing or caused by static electricity. <i>They will probably give you a lot of <b>static</b> about your editorial.</i>

<b>still</b>	Make or become still quieten. <i>He <b>still</b> lives with his mother.</i>
<b><u>stillness</u></b>	Tranquil silence. <i>Absolute <b>stillness</b> greeted our gaze.</i>
<b><u>tranquility</u></b>	A disposition free from stress or emotion.
<b>tranquelize</b>	Cause to be calm or quiet as by administering a sedative to.
<b>tranquillity</b>	An untroubled state; free from disturbances. <i>Passing cars are the only noise that disturbs the <b>tranquillity</b> of rural life.</i>
<b><u>unchanged</u></b>	Remaining in an original state. <i>An <b>unchanged</b> side for tonight s home game.</i>
<b>unflappable</b>	Not easily perturbed or excited or upset; marked by extreme calm and composure. <i><b>Unflappable</b> in a crisis.</i>
