calm	(of the weather) pleasantly free from wind. <i>Remained calm throughout the uproar.</i>
composed	Serenely self-possessed and free from agitation especially in times of stress. <i>The performer seemed completely composed as she stepped onto the stage.</i>
controlled	(of a drug) restricted by law with respect to use and possession. <i>The country s tightly controlled financial markets.</i>
cool	Inducing the impression of coolness used especially of greens and blues and violets when referring to color. <i>He gave a cool reception to the suggestion for a research centre.</i>
cool, calm, and collected	Neither warm nor very cold; giving relief from heat.

dispassionate	Unaffected by strong emotion or prejudice. <i>She dealt with life's disasters in a calm dispassionate way.</i>
even-tempered	Not easily irritated.
halcyon	Idyllically calm and peaceful; suggesting happy tranquillity. <i>A halcyon atmosphere.</i>
<u>idyllic</u>	Like an idyll; extremely happy, peaceful, or picturesque. <i>An idyllic spot for a picnic.</i>
<u>imperturbable</u>	Not easily perturbed or excited or upset; marked by extreme calm and composure. <i>Hitherto imperturbable he now showed signs of alarm.</i>
<u>mild</u>	Humble in spirit or manner suggesting retiring mildness or even cowed submissiveness. <i>A mild winter storm.</i>
pacific	Disposed to peace or of a peaceful nature. <i>The result of this pacific policy was that no troops were called up.</i>
peaceful	Peacefully resistant in response to injustice. <i>His peaceful mood vanished.</i>
<u>placid</u>	Free from disturbance by heavy waves. <i>The placid waters of a small lake.</i>
<u>pleasant</u>	(of a person or their manner) friendly and considerate; likeable. <i>They found him pleasant and cooperative.</i>
quiet	(of the sun) characterized by a low level of surface phenomena, such as sunspots. <i>Clothes in quiet good taste.</i>
relaxed	Free from tension and anxiety. <i>The relaxed atmosphere of the hotel.</i>
relaxing	Affording physical or mental rest. <i>A relaxing massage with aromatherapy oils.</i>
reposeful	Affording physical or mental rest. <i>The desire for reposeful contemplation.</i>
<u>restful</u>	Affording physical or mental rest. <i>The rooms were cool and restful.</i>
self-possessed	In full control of your faculties.
<u>serene</u>	Calm, peaceful, and untroubled; tranquil. <i>Serene certainty.</i>

<u>smooth</u>	Without breaks between notes smooth and connected. <i>A lovely smooth very fruity wine.</i>
<u>sober</u>	Not affected by a chemical substance (especially alcohol). <i>A sober view of life.</i>
<u>soothing</u>	Affording physical relief. <i>Almond oil is renowned for its soothing properties.</i>
still	Free from disturbance by heavy waves. <i>A still autumn day.</i>
stoical	Enduring pain and hardship without showing one's feelings or complaining. <i>He taught a stoical acceptance of suffering.</i>
unagitated	Not agitated; without losing self-possession.
<u>undisturbed</u>	Not disturbed. <i>He could pursue his studies undisturbed.</i>
<u>unemotional</u>	Cool and formal in manner. <i>A flat unemotional voice.</i>
unexcitable	(of a person) not easily excited. <i>An unexcitable temperament.</i>
unflappable	Having or showing calmness in a crisis. <i>Self contained unflappable Glaswegian common sense.</i>
unperturbed	Free from emotional agitation or nervous tension. <i>Kenneth seems unperturbed by the news.</i>
unruffled	(of a body of water) free from disturbance by heavy waves. <i>The unruffled waters of the lake.</i>
untroubled	Not beset by troubles or disturbance or distress. <i>A man untroubled by a guilty conscience.</i>

*She exuded **calmness** and good humour.*
- collected** (of individual works) brought together in one volume or edition.
*The **collected** works of Milton.*
- composed** Serenely self-possessed and free from agitation especially in times of stress.
*The performer seemed completely **composed** as she stepped onto the stage.*

halcyon	A tropical Asian and African kingfisher with brightly coloured plumage. <i>The halcyon days of the mid 1980s when profits were soaring.</i>
<u>hush</u>	Wash by removing particles. <i>Management took steps to hush up the dangers.</i>
<u>imperturbable</u>	Unable to be upset or excited; calm. <i>An imperturbable self possession.</i>
noiseless	Making no sound- Shakespeare. <i>The cycle is a noiseless form of transport.</i>
nonviolence	Peaceful resistance to a government by fasting or refusing to cooperate.
pacific	Relating to or bordering the Pacific Ocean. <i>The pacific temper seeks to settle disputes on grounds of justice rather than by force.</i>
peaceable	Disposed to peace or of a peaceful nature. <i>They met in a peaceable spirit.</i>
peaceful	Peacefully resistant in response to injustice. <i>Everything was so quiet and peaceful in the early morning.</i>
<u>placid</u>	Calm and peaceful, with little movement or activity. <i>A placid contented man.</i>
quiescent	Being quiet or still or inactive. <i>The quiescent melancholy of the town.</i>
quiet	Become quiet or quieter. <i>I ll have a quiet word with him.</i>
quietude	A state of peace and quiet. <i>It highlights her quietude and wise passivity.</i>
<u>restful</u>	Affording physical or mental rest. <i>She spent a restful night at home.</i>
reticence	The quality of being reticent; reserve. <i>The traditional emotional reticence of the British.</i>
<u>serene</u>	An expanse of clear sky or calm sea. <i>Not a cloud obscured the deep serene.</i>
<u>serenity</u>	The state of being calm, peaceful, and untroubled. <i>An oasis of serenity amidst the bustling city.</i>
silence	Keep from expression, for example by threats or pressure. <i>We finished our meal in silence.</i>
<u>static</u>	Concerned with or producing or caused by static electricity. <i>They will probably give you a lot of static about your editorial.</i>

still	Make or become still quieten. <i>He still lives with his mother.</i>
<u>stillness</u>	Tranquil silence. <i>Absolute stillness greeted our gaze.</i>
<u>tranquility</u>	A disposition free from stress or emotion.
tranquelize	Cause to be calm or quiet as by administering a sedative to.
tranquillity	An untroubled state; free from disturbances. <i>Passing cars are the only noise that disturbs the tranquillity of rural life.</i>
<u>unchanged</u>	Remaining in an original state. <i>An unchanged side for tonight s home game.</i>
unflappable	Not easily perturbed or excited or upset; marked by extreme calm and composure. <i>Unflappable in a crisis.</i>
