<b>barb</b>	A fleshy filament at the mouth of some fish such as barbel and catfish. <i>Barbed</i> wire.
<b>blade</b>	A cutting or thrusting weapon that has a long metal blade and a hilt with a hand guard. A <b>blade</b> of lint on his suit.
<b>clasp</b>	Fasten with or as if with a brooch. The child <b>clasped</b> my hands.
<b>dagger</b>	A moth with a dark dagger shaped marking on the forewing. He drew his <b>dagger</b> and stabbed the leader.
<b>fisherman</b>	Someone whose occupation is catching fish.
<b>fishing</b>	The act of someone who fishes as a diversion. <i>Fishing</i> boats.
<b>gig</b>	Long and light rowing boat; especially for racing. They played a <b>gig</b> in New Jersey.
<b>grip</b>	To grip or seize as in a wrestling match. Handlebar <b>grips</b> .
<b>harpoon</b>	Spear with a harpoon. Gilbert s father <b>harpooned</b> a five metre basking shark.
<b>impale</b>	Transfix or pierce with a sharp instrument. The <b>impaled</b> arms of her husband and her father.
<b>javelin</b>	An athletic competition in which a javelin is thrown as far as possible. His nearest rival in the <b>javelin</b> .
<b>joust</b>	Joust against somebody in a tournament by fighting on horseback. The king and the young knights at court passed their time in <b>jousts</b> tournaments and the chase.
<b>knife</b>	Stab someone with a knife. A shard of steel <b>knifed</b> through the mainsail.
<b>lance</b>	A weapon resembling a lance used in hunting fish or whales. Abscesses should not be <b>lanced</b> until there is a soft spot in the centre.
<b>lancet</b>	A lancet arch or window. A <b>lancet</b> clock.
<b>mace</b>	An official who carries a mace of office.
<b>pointed</b>	(of a remark or look) expressing criticism in a direct and unambiguous way. His face tapers to a <b>pointed</b> chin.
<b>poke</b>	Prod and stir a fire with a poker to make it burn more fiercely. She gave the fire a <b>poke</b> .

<b>prickle</b>	Cause a tingling sensation in. <i>The sound made her skin <b>prickle</b> with horror.</i>
<b>spear</b>	A spearman. <i>The branch <b>speared</b> up into the air.</i>
<b>spike</b>	Injure a player with the spikes on one's shoes. <i>He doubted they would <b>spike</b> the entire effort over this one negotiation.</i>
<b>stake</b>	A pole or stake set up to mark something as the start or end of a race track. <i><b>Stake</b> out the path.</i>
<b>sticker</b>	A determined or persistent person. <i>Warning <b>stickers</b> on the glass.</i>
<b>sword</b>	A cutting or thrusting weapon that has a long metal blade and a hilt with a hand guard. <i>Not many perished by the <b>sword</b>.</i>
<b>thorn</b>	A thorny bush shrub or tree especially a hawthorn. <i>He's a <b>thorn</b> in my flesh.</i>
<b>trident</b>	A US design of submarine-launched long-range ballistic missile.
<b>vis</b>	A holding device attached to a workbench; has two jaws to hold workpiece firmly in place.
<b>whaler</b>	Any of a number of large slender-bodied sharks.
<b>wire</b>	Provide fasten or reinforce with wires. <i>Electricians <b>wired</b> up searchlights.</i>
