## Associations of "Transforming" (30 Words)

<a href="#">alter</a>	Make an alteration to. <i>Plans to <b>alter</b> the dining hall.</i>
<b>change</b>	Change from one vehicle or transportation line to another. <i>I <b>changed</b> her on top of the table until she got too big.</i>
<a href="#">conversion</a>	A successful free throw or try for point after a touchdown. <i>They were carrying out a loft <b>conversion</b>.</i>
<b>convert</b>	A person who has been converted to another religious or political belief. <i>Could you <b>convert</b> my dollars into pounds.</i>
<b>disabuse</b>	Persuade (someone) that an idea or belief is mistaken. <i>He quickly <b>disabused</b> me of my fanciful notions.</i>
<a href="#">diversification</a>	The process of a business enlarging or varying its range of products or field of operation. <i>Studies have examined the <b>diversification</b> of plant species in Asia.</i>
<a href="#">diversion</a>	An activity that diverts the mind from tedious or serious concerns; a recreation or pastime. <i>People in search of <b>diversion</b>.</i>
<b>fluctuation</b>	The quality of being unsteady and subject to changes. <i>The <b>fluctuations</b> of the sea.</i>
<a href="#">flux</a>	Treat a metal object with a flux to promote melting. <i>The <b>flux</b> of ions across the membrane.</i>
<a href="#">interchangeable</a>	(of two things) able to be interchanged. <i>Eyepieces are <b>interchangeable</b> and one can use any eyepiece with any telescope.</i>
<b>metamorphose</b>	Change or cause to change completely in form or nature. <i>Feed the larvae to your fish before they <b>metamorphose</b> into adults.</i>
<b>modify</b>	Make less severe or harsh or extreme. <i>She may be prepared to <b>modify</b> her views.</i>

<b>proselyte</b>	A Gentile who has converted to Judaism.
<b>recast</b>	Give (a metal object) a different form by melting it down and reshaping it. <i>In 1919 the bells were <b>recast</b>.</i>
<b><u>reconstruct</u></b>	Build or form (something) again after it has been damaged or destroyed. <i><b>Reconstruct</b> the events of 20 years ago.</i>
<b>remodel</b>	Shape (a figure or object) again or differently. <i>We are <b>remodeling</b> these rooms.</i>
<b>remold</b>	Shape again or shape differently.
<b>reshape</b>	Shape again or shape differently. <i>The new foreign minister <b>reshaped</b> the foreign policy of his country.</i>
<b><u>ripple</u></b>	A thing resembling a ripple or ripples in appearance or movement. <i>A family block of raspberry <b>ripple</b>.</i>
<b>transfigure</b>	Elevate or idealize, in allusion to Christ's transfiguration. <i>The world is made luminous and is <b>transfigured</b>.</i>
<b>transformation</b>	The act of changing in form or shape or appearance. <i>British society underwent a radical <b>transformation</b>.</i>
<b>transition</b>	Make or undergo a transition from one state or system to another. <i>He <b>transitioned</b> into filmmaking easily.</i>
<b>transmogrify</b>	Transform in a surprising or magical manner. <i>His home was transmogrified into a hippy crash pad.</i>
<b><u>transmute</u></b>	Subject (base metals) to alchemical transmutation. <i>The discovery that elements can <b>transmute</b> by radioactivity.</i>
<b><u>variability</u></b>	The quality of being subject to variation. <i>Seasonal <b>variability</b> in water levels.</i>
<b><u>variance</u></b>	An event that departs from expectations. <i>The stylistic <b>variances</b> of classical dance.</i>
<b><u>variant</u></b>	Differing from a norm or standard. <i>A <b>variant</b> of the same word.</i>
<b>variation</b>	A change or slight difference in condition, amount, or level, typically within certain limits. <i>Regional <b>variations</b> in house prices.</i>
<b><u>vary</u></b>	Make something more diverse and varied. <i>His moods <b>vary</b> depending on the weather.</i>
<b>wavelet</b>	A small wave on the surface of a liquid.
