Associations of "Transforming" (30 Words)

alter	Make an alteration to. <i>Plans to alter the dining hall.</i>
change	Change from one vehicle or transportation line to another. <i>I changed her on top of the table until she got too big.</i>
conversion	A successful free throw or try for point after a touchdown. <i>They were carrying out a loft conversion.</i>
convert	A person who has been converted to another religious or political belief. <i>Could you convert my dollars into pounds.</i>
disabuse	Persuade (someone) that an idea or belief is mistaken. <i>He quickly disabused me of my fanciful notions.</i>
diversification	The process of a business enlarging or varying its range of products or field of operation. <i>Studies have examined the diversification of plant species in Asia.</i>
diversion	An activity that diverts the mind from tedious or serious concerns; a recreation or pastime. <i>People in search of diversion.</i>
fluctuation	The quality of being unsteady and subject to changes. <i>The fluctuations of the sea.</i>
flux	Treat a metal object with a flux to promote melting. <i>The flux of ions across the membrane.</i>
interchangeable	(of two things) able to be interchanged. <i>Eyepieces are interchangeable and one can use any eyepiece with any telescope.</i>
metamorphose	Change or cause to change completely in form or nature. <i>Feed the larvae to your fish before they metamorphose into adults.</i>
modify	Make less severe or harsh or extreme. <i>She may be prepared to modify her views.</i>

proselyte	A Gentile who has converted to Judaism.
recast	Give (a metal object) a different form by melting it down and reshaping it. <i>In 1919 the bells were recast.</i>
<u>reconstruct</u>	Build or form (something) again after it has been damaged or destroyed. <i>Reconstruct the events of 20 years ago.</i>
remodel	Shape (a figure or object) again or differently. <i>We are remodeling these rooms.</i>
remold	Shape again or shape differently.
reshape	Shape again or shape differently. <i>The new foreign minister reshaped the foreign policy of his country.</i>
<u>ripple</u>	A thing resembling a ripple or ripples in appearance or movement. <i>A family block of raspberry ripple.</i>
transfigure	Elevate or idealize, in allusion to Christ's transfiguration. <i>The world is made luminous and is transfigured.</i>
transformation	The act of changing in form or shape or appearance. <i>British society underwent a radical transformation.</i>
transition	Make or undergo a transition from one state or system to another. <i>He transitioned into filmmaking easily.</i>
transmogrify	Transform in a surprising or magical manner. <i>His home was transmogrified into a hippy crash pad.</i>
<u>transmute</u>	Subject (base metals) to alchemical transmutation. <i>The discovery that elements can transmute by radioactivity.</i>
<u>variability</u>	The quality of being subject to variation. <i>Seasonal variability in water levels.</i>
<u>variance</u>	An event that departs from expectations. <i>The stylistic variances of classical dance.</i>
<u>variant</u>	Differing from a norm or standard. <i>A variant of the same word.</i>
variation	A change or slight difference in condition, amount, or level, typically within certain limits. <i>Regional variations in house prices.</i>
<u>vary</u>	Make something more diverse and varied. <i>His moods vary depending on the weather.</i>
wavelet	A small wave on the surface of a liquid.
