#### Definitions of "Transmit" as a verb

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "transmit" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- Cause (something) to pass on from one person or place to another.
- Allow (heat, light, sound, electricity, or other energy) to pass through a medium.
- Send from one person or place to another.
- Transmit or serve as the medium for transmission.
- Broadcast over the airwaves, as in radio or television.
- Communicate or be a medium for (an idea or emotion.
- Transfer to another.
- Broadcast or send out (an electrical signal or a radio or television programme.





# Synonyms of "Transmit" as a verb (33 Words)


air	Expose a room to the open air in order to ventilate it. <i>We cannot <b>air</b> this X rated song.</i>
<u>beam</u>	Express with a beaming face or smile. <i>The sun s rays <b>beam</b>ed down.</i>
<u>bear</u>	Bring forth. Steamboats <b>bear</b> the traveller out of Kerrerra Sound.
broadcast	Broadcast over the airwaves as in radio or television. The second method is to <b>broadcast</b> the seeds together with not more than 1 kg to the acre of rapeseed.
<u>carry</u>	Win in an election. This boat can only <b>carry</b> a small sail.



<u>channel</u>	Direct towards a particular end or object. Meg Ryan plays Avery as if she s <b>channel</b> ling Nicole Kidman.
channelise	Cause to form a channel.
channelize	Make a channel for; provide with a channel. <i>Channelize</i> the country for better transportation.
communicate	Transmit (heat or motion. <i>The dining room <b>communicate</b>s with the kitchen.</i>
conduct	Transmit a form of energy such as heat or electricity by conduction. <i>He conducted himself with the utmost propriety.</i>
<u>convey</u>	Serve as a means for expressing something. <i>Mr Harvey and his daughter have asked me to</i> <b>convey</b> <i>their very kind regards.</i>
<u>dispatch</u>	Kill intentionally and with premeditation. The government <b>dispatch</b> ed 150 police to restore order.
<u>emit</u>	Produce and discharge (something, especially gas or radiation. She <b>emit</b> ted a sound like laughter.
hand on	Guide or conduct or usher somewhere.
<u>impart</u>	Transmit (knowledge or skills. The teachers <b>impart</b> ed a great deal of knowledge to their pupils.
mediate	Occupy an intermediate or middle position or form a connecting link or stage between two others. <i>He mediated a settlement.</i>
pass on	Pass into a specified state or condition.
pipe	Transport by pipeline. <i>Pipe</i> oil water and gas into the desert.
podcast	Make a digital audio file available as a podcast.
<u>publish</u>	Prepare and issue for public distribution or sale. The photo has not been <b>publish</b> ed on her Instagram account.
put on air	Cause (someone) to undergo something.
put on the air	Formulate in a particular style or language.
radio	Communicate or send a message by radio. We <b>radio</b> ed for help.
<u>relay</u>	Control or operate by relay. Please <b>relay</b> the news to the villagers.
send	Send a message or letter. <b>Send</b> me your latest results.



send out	Transport commercially.
show	Show in or as in a picture. The whole nation is waiting for him to <b>show</b> leadership.
telecast	Broadcast via television. The programme will be <b>telecast</b> simultaneously to nearly 150 cities.
televise	Broadcast via television. The network chose not to <b>televise</b> the opening ceremony.
transfer	Transfer from one place or period to another. <b>Transfer</b> the packet from his trouser pockets to a pocket in his jacket.
transport	Transport commercially. The book <b>transport</b> ed her to new worlds.
videocast	Make available as a videocast. The ceremonies were <b>videocast</b> live on the internet.
wire	Snare an animal with wire. A microphone <b>wire</b> d to a loudspeaker.





### Usage Examples of "Transmit" as a verb

- The theatrical gift of being able to transmit emotion.
- Sexually transmitted diseases.
- The three bones transmit sound waves to the inner ear.
- The programme was transmitted on 7 October.
- Transmit a message.

<u>bulletin</u>	Make public by bulletin.
<u>carry</u>	The act of carrying something. <i>He could not <b>carry</b> the cabinet.</i>



communicate	Impart or pass on (information, news, or ideas. <i>He and his sons haven t</i> <b>communicate</b> <i>d for years.</i>
communication	Social contact. Television is an effective means of <b>communication</b> .
consignee	The person to whom merchandise is delivered over.
<u>convey</u>	Transmit or serve as the medium for transmission. It s impossible to <b>convey</b> how lost I felt.
conveyance	Document effecting a property transfer. Adventurers attempt the trail using all manner of <b>conveyance</b> s including mountain bikes and motorcycles.
<u>correspondence</u>	Letters, emails, etc. sent or received. <i>The results of two tests were in correspondence</i> .
delivery	(baseball) the act of throwing a baseball by a pitcher to a batter. <i>Her <b>delivery</b> was stilted.</i>
<u>dispatch</u>	Send away towards a designated goal. The government <b>dispatch</b> ed 150 police to restore order.
email	Send a message by email. Reading <b>email</b> has become the first task of the morning.
ferry	Convey in a ferry or other ship or boat especially across a short stretch of water. <i>Ambulances ferried the injured to hospital.</i>
ferryboat	A boat that transports people or vehicles across a body of water and operates on a regular schedule.
fetch	The action of fetching. The dog <b>fetch</b> ed the hat.
<u>interact</u>	Communicate or be involved directly. The user <b>interact</b> s directly with the library.
mail	A single delivery or collection of mail. I did not receive any <b>mail</b> .
mailing	Mail sent by a sender at one time. The postmark indicates the time of <b>mailing</b> .
message	Send a message to someone especially by email text app or other electronic means. She <b>message</b> d the final report by fax.
<u>messenger</u>	Send a document or package by messenger. Could you have it <b>messenger</b> ed over to me.



post	Assign to a post put into a post. If you hurry you ll catch the <b>post</b> .
<u>receiver</u>	A person who gets or accepts something that has been sent or given to them. The <b>receiver</b> of a gift.
recipient	A person or thing that receives or is awarded something. The <b>recipient</b> of the Nobel Peace Prize.
<u>relay</u>	A signal or broadcast transmitted by a relay. A <b>relay</b> of a performance live from the concert hall.
send	Send a message or letter. It s the spectacle and music that <b>send</b> us not the words.
sender	Set used to broadcast radio or tv signals. <i>Return to <b>sender</b>.</i>
spam	A tinned meat product made mainly from ham. An autogenerated <b>spam</b> website.
transfer	Transferring ownership. A <b>transfer</b> of wealth to the EU s poorer nations.
transport	A convict who was transported to a penal colony. Many possess their own forms of <b>transport</b> .
transportation	The United States federal department that institutes and coordinates national transportation programs created in 1966. <i>The sentence was one of transportation for life.</i>
