# Synonyms of "Transmits" as a verb (14 Words)

air	Expose to cool or cold air so as to cool or freshen. This show will <b>air</b> Saturdays at 2 P M.
<u>beam</u>	Express with a beaming face or smile. The satellite <b>beam</b> ed back radio signals to scientists on Earth.
broadcast	Broadcast over the airwaves as in radio or television. <b>Broadcast</b> the news.
<u>carry</u>	Be known or marked by. Nerves <b>carry</b> visual information from the eyes.
<u>channel</u>	Cause to pass along or through a specified route or medium. Many countries <b>channel</b> their aid through charities.
channelise	Make a channel for; provide with a channel.
channelize	Cause to form a channel. <i>Channelize</i> a stream.



communicate	Share or exchange information, news, or ideas. <b>Communicate</b> a disease.
conduct	Transmit a form of energy such as heat or electricity by conduction. He <b>conduct</b> ed us through his personal gallery of the Civil War.
<u>convey</u>	Serve as a means for expressing something. It s impossible to <b>convey</b> how lost I felt.
<u>impart</u>	Bestow a quality on. <i>Impart</i> a new skill to the students.
send	Send a message or letter. It s the spectacle and music that <b>send</b> us not the words.
transfer	Transfer from one place or period to another. Passengers have to <b>transfer</b> at Heathrow for onward international flights.
transport	Transport commercially. The book <b>transport</b> ed her to new worlds.

# Associations of "Transmits" (30 Words)

broadcast	Broadcast over the airwaves as in radio or television. The second method is to <b>broadcast</b> the seeds together with not more than 1 kg to the acre of rapeseed.
<u>bulletin</u>	Make public by bulletin.
<u>carry</u>	An act of carrying something from one place to another. I <b>carry</b> a lot of life insurance.
communicate	Convey or transmit (an emotion or feeling) in a non-verbal way. <i>Communicate a disease.</i>
communication	The activity of communicating; the activity of conveying information. <i>A communications network.</i>



consignee	The person to whom merchandise is delivered over.
<u>convey</u>	Communicate (a message or information. Pipes were laid to <b>convey</b> water to the house.
conveyance	The action or process of transporting or carrying someone or something from one place to another. Adventurers attempt the trail using all manner of <b>conveyance</b> s including mountain bikes and motorcycles.
<u>correspondence</u>	An attribute of a shape or relation; exact reflection of form on opposite sides of a dividing line or plane. The organization engaged in detailed <b>correspondence</b> with local MPs.
delivery	The action of delivering letters, parcels, or goods. <i>His reluctant <b>delivery</b> of bad news.</i>
<u>dispatch</u>	Deal with (a task or opponent) quickly and efficiently. A resolution authorizing the <b>dispatch</b> of a peacekeeping force.
email	Send an email to someone. Call fax or <b>email</b> for a free demo.
ferry	Travel by ferry. Ambulances ferried the injured to hospital.
ferryboat	A boat that transports people or vehicles across a body of water and operates on a regular schedule.
fetch	The action of fetching. The dog <b>fetch</b> ed the hat.
<u>interact</u>	Act in such a way as to have an effect on each other. All the stages in the process <b>interact</b> .
mail	Email. I ll <b>mail</b> you the paper when it s written.
mailing	The action or process of sending something by mail. <i>The postmark indicates the time of</i> <b>mailing</b> .
message	Send as a message. She <b>message</b> d the final report by fax.
<u>messenger</u>	Send a document or package by messenger. Could you have it <b>messenger</b> ed over to me.
post	A goalpost. A pair of <b>post</b> s marked the goal.
<u>receiver</u>	A person who gets or accepts something that has been sent or given to them. A satellite <b>receiver</b> .



recipient	Receiving or capable of receiving something. The <b>recipient</b> of the Nobel Peace Prize.
<u>relay</u>	A signal or broadcast transmitted by a relay. Gangs of workers were sent in <b>relay</b> s.
send	Send a message or letter. <b>Send</b> me your latest results.
sender	A person who sends or transmits a message, letter, email, etc. <i>Evidence submitted late will be returned to the <b>sender</b>.</i>
spam	A tinned meat product made mainly from ham. An autogenerated <b>spam</b> website.
transfer	Transfer somebody to a different position or location of work. The <b>transfer</b> of the music from record to tape suppressed much of the background noise.
transport	Transport commercially. She was <b>transport</b> ed with pleasure.
transportation	The United States federal department that institutes and coordinates national transportation programs created in 1966. <i>Transportation</i> on the site includes a monorail.
