- *Broadcast over the airwaves, as in radio or television.*



Synonyms of "Transmits" as a verb (14 Words)

air	Expose to cool or cold air so as to cool or freshen. <i>This show will air Saturdays at 2 P M.</i>
<u>beam</u>	Express with a beaming face or smile. <i>The satellite beamed back radio signals to scientists on Earth.</i>
broadcast	Broadcast over the airwaves as in radio or television. <i>Broadcast the news.</i>
<u>carry</u>	Be known or marked by. <i>Nerves carry visual information from the eyes.</i>
<u>channel</u>	Cause to pass along or through a specified route or medium. <i>Many countries channel their aid through charities.</i>
channelise	Make a channel for; provide with a channel.
channelize	Cause to form a channel. <i>Channelize a stream.</i>

- communicate** Share or exchange information, news, or ideas.
Communicate a disease.
- conduct** Transmit a form of energy such as heat or electricity by conduction.
*He **conducted** us through his personal gallery of the Civil War.*
- convey** Serve as a means for expressing something.
*It s impossible to **convey** how lost I felt.*
- impart** Bestow a quality on.
***Impart** a new skill to the students.*
- send** Send a message or letter.
*It s the spectacle and music that **send** us not the words.*
- transfer** Transfer from one place or period to another.
*Passengers have to **transfer** at Heathrow for onward international flights.*
- transport** Transport commercially.
*The book **transported** her to new worlds.*

Associations of "Transmits" (30 Words)

broadcast	Broadcast over the airwaves as in radio or television. <i>The second method is to broadcast the seeds together with not more than 1 kg to the acre of rapeseed.</i>
bulletin	Make public by bulletin.
carry	An act of carrying something from one place to another. <i>I carry a lot of life insurance.</i>
communicate	Convey or transmit (an emotion or feeling) in a non-verbal way. <i>Communicate a disease.</i>
communication	The activity of communicating; the activity of conveying information. <i>A communications network.</i>

consignee	The person to whom merchandise is delivered over.
convey	Communicate (a message or information). <i>Pipes were laid to convey water to the house.</i>
conveyance	The action or process of transporting or carrying someone or something from one place to another. <i>Adventurers attempt the trail using all manner of conveyances including mountain bikes and motorcycles.</i>
correspondence	An attribute of a shape or relation; exact reflection of form on opposite sides of a dividing line or plane. <i>The organization engaged in detailed correspondence with local MPs.</i>
delivery	The action of delivering letters, parcels, or goods. <i>His reluctant delivery of bad news.</i>
dispatch	Deal with (a task or opponent) quickly and efficiently. <i>A resolution authorizing the dispatch of a peacekeeping force.</i>
email	Send an email to someone. <i>Call fax or email for a free demo.</i>
ferry	Travel by ferry. <i>Ambulances ferried the injured to hospital.</i>
ferryboat	A boat that transports people or vehicles across a body of water and operates on a regular schedule.
fetch	The action of fetching. <i>The dog fetched the hat.</i>
interact	Act in such a way as to have an effect on each other. <i>All the stages in the process interact.</i>
mail	Email. <i>I ll mail you the paper when it s written.</i>
mailing	The action or process of sending something by mail. <i>The postmark indicates the time of mailing.</i>
message	Send as a message. <i>She messaged the final report by fax.</i>
messenger	Send a document or package by messenger. <i>Could you have it messengered over to me.</i>
post	A goalpost. <i>A pair of posts marked the goal.</i>
receiver	A person who gets or accepts something that has been sent or given to them. <i>A satellite receiver.</i>

recipient	Receiving or capable of receiving something. <i>The recipient of the Nobel Peace Prize.</i>
relay	A signal or broadcast transmitted by a relay. <i>Gangs of workers were sent in relays.</i>
send	Send a message or letter. <i>Send me your latest results.</i>
sender	A person who sends or transmits a message, letter, email, etc. <i>Evidence submitted late will be returned to the sender.</i>
spam	A tinned meat product made mainly from ham. <i>An autogenerated spam website.</i>
transfer	Transfer somebody to a different position or location of work. <i>The transfer of the music from record to tape suppressed much of the background noise.</i>
transport	Transport commercially. <i>She was transported with pleasure.</i>
transportation	The United States federal department that institutes and coordinates national transportation programs created in 1966. <i>Transportation on the site includes a monorail.</i>
