**transmission** Communication by means of transmitted signals.  
*The **transmission** of the virus.*

**transmittal** The act of sending a message; causing a message to be transmitted.  
*A law prohibiting unlicensed money **transmittals**.*



## Associations of "Transmitting" (30 Words)

**broadcast** Broadcast over the airwaves as in radio or television.  
*A **broadcast** journalist.*

**bulletin** Make public by bulletin.

<b>carry</b>	An act of carrying something from one place to another. <i>Do you <b>carry</b> kerosene heaters.</i>
<b>communicate</b>	Transmit information. <i>The ability of good teachers to <b>communicate</b> their own enthusiasm.</i>
<b>communication</b>	Something that is communicated by or to or between people or groups. <i>A city providing excellent road and rail <b>communications</b>.</i>
<b>consignee</b>	The person to whom merchandise is delivered over.
<b>convey</b>	Transport or carry to a place. <i>It s impossible to <b>convey</b> how lost I felt.</i>
<b>conveyance</b>	A legal document effecting the transfer of property in the case of an unregistered title. <i>A busy centre for the <b>conveyance</b> of agricultural produce from the Billingshurst area.</i>
<b>correspondence</b>	Communication by the exchange of letters. <i>Sophie wrote a letter to Rosamund with whom she kept up a regular <b>correspondence</b>.</i>
<b>delivery</b>	The act of delivering or distributing something (as goods or mail). <i>His reluctant <b>delivery</b> of bad news.</i>
<b>dispatch</b>	The act of sending off something. <i>The situation might change so he should proceed with <b>dispatch</b>.</i>
<b>email</b>	A message sent by email. <i>Call fax or <b>email</b> for a free demo.</i>
<b>ferry</b>	Convey in a ferry or other ship or boat especially across a short stretch of water. <i>Ambulances ferried the injured to hospital.</i>
<b>ferryboat</b>	A boat that transports people or vehicles across a body of water and operates on a regular schedule.
<b>fetch</b>	The action of fetching. <i>The land could <b>fetch</b> over a million pounds.</i>
<b>interact</b>	Communicate or be involved directly. <i>People who <b>interact</b> daily.</i>
<b>mail</b>	A vehicle such as a train carrying mail. <i>You ve got <b>mail</b>.</i>
<b>mailing</b>	The action or process of sending something by mail. <i>The postmark indicates the time of <b>mailing</b>.</i>
<b>message</b>	Send a message to. <i>An error <b>message</b>.</i>

<b><u>messenger</u></b>	Send a document or package by messenger. <i>Nitric oxide is an intercellular <b>messenger</b>.</i>
<b>post</b>	A goalpost. <i>Robertson at the near <b>post</b> headed wide.</i>
<b><u>receiver</u></b>	A player who specializes in catching passes. <i>The company is in the hands of the <b>receivers</b>.</i>
<b>recipient</b>	A person who receives something. <i>The <b>recipient</b> of the Nobel Peace Prize.</i>
<b><u>relay</u></b>	Control or operate by relay. <i>The wagons were pulled by <b>relays</b> of horses.</i>
<b>send</b>	Send a message or letter. <i>It s the spectacle and music that <b>send</b> us not the words.</i>
<b>sender</b>	A person who sends or transmits a message, letter, email, etc. <i><b>Senders</b> of unwanted emails.</i>
<b>spam</b>	Send the same message indiscriminately to (a large number of internet users). <i>An autogenerated <b>spam</b> website.</i>
<b>transfer</b>	Someone who transfers or is transferred from one position to another. <i>I went to sleep on the couch before <b>transferring</b> to my bedroom later in the night.</i>
<b>transport</b>	A convict who was transported to a penal colony. <i>The bulk of freight traffic was <b>transported</b> by lorry.</i>
<b>transportation</b>	The United States federal department that institutes and coordinates national transportation programs created in 1966. <i>The era of global mass <b>transportation</b>.</i>
