- Easily understood or seen through (because of a lack of subtlety.
- Easy to perceive or detect.



- (of a process or interface) functioning without the user being aware of its presence.
- *Transmitting light; able to be seen through with clarity.*
- Having thoughts or feelings that are easily perceived; open.

<u>conspicuous</u>	Clearly visible. Made herself conspicuous by her exhibitionistic preening.
crystalline	Consisting of or containing or of the nature of crystals. <i>Granite is crystalline</i> .
delicate	Difficult to handle; requiring great tact. <i>Owls have a delicate balance with their habitat.</i>
diaphanous	(especially of fabric) light, delicate, and translucent. A hat with a diaphanous veil.
direct	Moving from west to east on the celestial sphere or for planets around the sun in the same direction as the Earth. A direct butt joint between surfaces of steel.
discernible	Capable of being perceived clearly. The inscription was barely discernible .
distinct	Constituting a separate entity or part. The ship appeared as a distinct silhouette.
<u>evident</u>	Capable of being seen or noticed. <i>Evident</i> hostility.
<u>explicit</u>	Of a person stating something in an explicit manner. <i>Explicit sexual scenes.</i>
filmy	(especially of fabric) thin and translucent. <i>Filmy</i> white voile.
fine	Characterized by elegance or refinement or accomplishment. A fine violinist.
flagrant	(of an action considered wrong or immoral) conspicuously or obviously offensive. A flagrant violation of the law.
flimsy	Lacking solidity or strength. <i>Flimsy</i> construction.
forthright	Proceeding directly forwards. His most forthright attack yet on the reforms.



frank	Clearly manifest; evident. Frank enjoyment.
gauze-like	So thin as to transmit light.
gauzy	Resembling gauze; thin and translucent. A gauzy dress.
<u>glaring</u>	Giving out or reflecting a strong or dazzling light. A glaring error.
glassy	(of sound) resembling the sharp noise made when glass is struck. <i>Glassy</i> porcelain.
gossamer	So thin as to transmit light. <i>Gossamer</i> cobwebs.
guileless	Devoid of guile; innocent and without deception. <i>His face once so open and guileless.</i>
<u>honest</u>	(of an action) done with good intentions even if unsuccessful or misguided. <i>Honest</i> reporting.
indisputable	Not open to question; obviously true. <i>Indisputable</i> or sure proof.
ingenuous	Characterized by an inability to mask your feelings; not devious. She s staggeringly ingenuous or possibly very cunning indeed.
innocent	Free from moral wrong; not corrupted. She is a poor innocent young creature.
light	Of the military or industry using or being relatively small or light arms or equipment. <i>Felt light in the head.</i>
lightweight	Weighing relatively little compared with another item or object of similar use. A lightweight grey suit.
limpid	Transmitting light; able to be seen through with clarity. <i>Limpid</i> blue eyes.
<u>liquid</u>	Existing as or having characteristics of a liquid especially tending to flow. <i>Liquid</i> or fluid assets.
<u>lucid</u>	Showing or having the ability to think clearly, especially in intervals between periods of confusion or insanity. <i>Lucid air</i> .




<u>manifest</u>	Clear or obvious to the eye or mind. <i>Her manifest</i> charm and proven ability.
<u>noticeable</u>	Undesirably noticeable. After a noticeable pause the lecturer continued.
obvious	Easily perceived or understood; clear, self-evident, or apparent. It was obvious a storm was coming in.
open	Openly straightforward and direct without reserve or secretiveness. <i>The job is still open</i> .
<u>palpable</u>	Able to be touched or felt. Felt sudden anger in a palpable wave.
<u>patent</u>	Made and marketed under a patent proprietary. <i>Patent</i> advantages.
pellucid	Translucently clear. His pellucid singing tone.
perceptible	(especially of a slight movement or change of state) able to be seen or noticed. A perceptible decline in public confidence.
plain	Not decorated or elaborate; simple or basic in character. There were indrawn breaths at such plain speaking.
plain as the nose on your face	Lacking patterns especially in color.
<u>recognizable</u>	Easily perceived; easy to become aware of. <i>This situation produces recognizable stress symptoms.</i>
see-through	So thin as to transmit light.
self-evident	Evident without proof or argument.
shameless	(of a person or their conduct) characterized by or showing a lack of shame; barefaced or brazen. <i>His shameless hypocrisy.</i>
<u>sheer</u>	(especially of a cliff or wall) perpendicular or nearly so. It s been sheer hard work.
simple	(botany) of leaf shapes; of leaves having no divisions or subdivisions. A simple game.
<u>straight</u>	Simple straightforward. Sick for five straight days.



<u>straightforward</u>	Without concealment or deception; honest. A straightforward young man.
<u>thin</u>	Relatively thin in consistency or low in density not viscous. <i>A thin gawky adolescent.</i>
translucent	Allowing light to pass through diffusely. <i>Translucent amber</i> .
<u>unambiguous</u>	Having or exhibiting a single clearly defined meaning- Mario Vargas Llosa. <i>Instructions should be unambiguous.</i>
unconcealed	(especially of an emotion) not concealed; obvious. Her unconcealed hostility poisoned the atmosphere.
undisguised	(of a feeling) not disguised or concealed; open. She looked at him with undisguised contempt.
<u>unequivocal</u>	Leaving no doubt; unambiguous. Unequivocal evidence.
<u>unmistakable</u>	Not able to be mistaken for anything else; very distinctive. <i>His opposition to slavery was unmistakable.</i>
unreserved	Not cautious or reticent. A tall unreserved young man.
vaporous	Filled with vapor. The vaporous notion of free will.
vapourous	So thin as to transmit light.
<u>visible</u>	In a position of public prominence. A highly visible member of the royal entourage.

crystalline	Transmitting light; able to be seen through with clarity. The cold crystalline water of melted snow.
diaphanous	So thin as to transmit light. A diaphanous dress of pale gold.
directness	Trueness of course toward a goal. Rivaling a hawk in directness of aim.
forthrightness	The quality of being honest and straightforward in attitude and speech.
<u>friendliness</u>	A feeling of liking for another person; enjoyment in their company. I was overwhelmed by the friendliness of the people here.
<u>glass</u>	Glassware. A beer glass .
glassy	Resembling glass in smoothness and shininess and slickness- Willa Cather. ${\it Glassy}$ lavas.
guileless	Free of deceit. His face once so open and guileless .
<u>honest</u>	Not forged. My honest opinion.
<u>honesty</u>	Referring to or using a way of charging for goods or services that relies on the customers to leave money in an unattended receptacle even though there is no one to collect their payments. <i>I bought potatoes and tomatoes from the roadside stall putting 3 in the</i> <i>honesty</i> box.
integrity	Internal consistency or lack of corruption in electronic data. <i>Integrity</i> checking.
limpid	(of language) transparently clear; easily understandable. Could see the sand on the bottom of the limpid pool.
<u>lucid</u>	Showing or having the ability to think clearly, especially in intervals between periods of confusion or insanity. <i>A lucid account.</i>
<u>naive</u>	Of or created by one without formal training simple or naive in style. A teenager s naive ignorance of life.
<u>openness</u>	Willingness or readiness to receive (especially impressions or ideas. Fitness levels have evolved to increase the speed and openness of the game.
pellucid	(of language) transparently clear; easily understandable. Mountains reflected in the pellucid waters.
perspicuity	Clarity as a consequence of being perspicuous.



perspicuous	Clearly expressed and easily understood; lucid. It provides simpler and more perspicuous explanations than its rivals.
plain	Unmistakably plain is often used informally for plainly. The main problem is just plain exhaustion.
<u>pure</u>	Of color being chromatically pure not diluted with white or grey or black. <i>Pure</i> oxygen.
simple	Denoting a group that has no proper normal subgroup. A simple white blouse.
translucent	(of a substance) allowing light, but not detailed shapes, to pass through; semi-transparent. <i>Her beautiful translucent skin.</i>
transparency	Permitting the free passage of electromagnetic radiation. <i>The transparency of ice.</i>
vaporous	Of the nature of, characterized by, or filled with vapour. <i>The terminology is rather vaporous</i> .
