Associations of "Trash talk" (30 Words)

argument	An independent variable associated with a function or proposition and determining its value For example in the expression $y = F(x)$ the arguments of the function F are x and x and the value is y . <i>It was a strong argument that his hypothesis was true.</i>
babble	Reveal something secret or confidential by talking carelessly. <i>A confused babble of voices.</i>
chat	Songbirds having a chattering call. <i>He dropped in for a chat.</i>
chatter	Make noise as if chattering away. <i>The wipers should operate without chatter.</i>
confabulate	Have a conference in order to talk something over. <i>She could be heard on the telephone confabulating with someone.</i>
confer	Have a conference in order to talk something over. <i>The Minister may have exceeded the powers conferred on him by Parliament.</i>
consult	An act of consulting a professional a consultation. <i>You should consult the dictionary.</i>
consultation	The action or process of formally consulting or discussing. <i>They improved standards in consultation with consumer representatives.</i>
declaim	Speak against in an impassioned manner. <i>She declaimed her views.</i>
dialog	The lines spoken by characters in drama or fiction.
dialogue	Provide a film or play with a dialogue. <i>Passages of dialogue.</i>
discourse	A connected series of utterances; a text or conversation. <i>She could discourse at great length on the history of Europe.</i>

discuss	Speak with others about something talk something over in detail have a discussion. <i>In Chapter Six I discuss problems that arise in applying Darwin s ideas.</i>
discussion	A conversation or debate about a specific topic. <i>See Appendix One for a more detailed discussion.</i>
disputation	Debate or argument. <i>Scholastic disputations.</i>
foregoing	Especially of writing or speech; going before. <i>The foregoing analysis of the economic class structure.</i>
forum	A website or web page where users can post comments about a particular issue or topic and reply to other users' postings. <i>We hope these pages act as a forum for debate.</i>
gossip	Engage in gossip. <i>The divorce caused much gossip.</i>
mumble	Grind with the gums; chew without teeth and with great difficulty. <i>Rosie had replied in a mumble.</i>
mutter	A low continuous indistinct sound; often accompanied by movement of the lips without the production of articulate speech. <i>He muttered something under his breath.</i>
prate	Speak (about unimportant matters) rapidly and incessantly. <i>I heard him prate on for at least an hour and a half.</i>
prompting	Persuasion formulated as a suggestion. <i>After some prompting the defendant gave the police his name.</i>
rebut	Drive back or repel (a person or attack). <i>He had to rebut charges of acting for the convenience of his political friends.</i>
remark	Regard with attention; notice. <i>He remarked the man s inflamed eyelids.</i>
saying	A collection of short, pithy expressions identified with a particular person, especially a political or religious leader. <i>This is stated in the sayings of the Prophet.</i>
speak	Say something in order to convey information or to express a feeling. <i>They speak a strange dialect.</i>
speaker	Someone who expresses in language; someone who talks (especially someone who delivers a public speech or someone especially garrulous). <i>Our guest speaker will give an audiovisual presentation.</i>
talker	A person who speaks or converses, often in a specified way. <i>A fast talker with an encyclopedic mind.</i>

verbalize

Convert into a verb.

*This depressed patient does not **verbalize**.*

verbosity

The fact or quality of using more words than needed; wordiness.

*A critic with a reputation for **verbosity**.*
