<b>countrywide</b>	Extending throughout a nation. <i>A <b>countrywide</b> tour.</i>

<b>ecumenical</b>	Promoting or relating to unity among the world's Christian Churches. <i><b>Ecumenical</b> thinking.</i>
<b><u>extensively</u></b>	To a large or detailed degree. <i>He has written <b>extensively</b> about the project.</i>
<b><u>far</u></b>	Being of a considerable distance or length. <i>The <b>far</b> side of the road.</i>
<b><u>general</u></b>	A high rank of officer in the army and in the US air force above lieutenant general and below field marshal general of the army or general of the air force. <i>The <b>general</b> discontent.</i>
<b>generic</b>	(of goods, especially medicinal drugs) having no brand name; not protected by a registered trademark. <i>Is there a <b>generic</b> Asian mind.</i>
<b><u>global</u></b>	Relating to or encompassing the whole of something, or of a group of things. <i><b>Global</b> monetary policy.</i>
<b>globe</b>	Form something into a globe. <i>Goods from all over the <b>globe</b>.</i>
<b>greenpeace</b>	An international organization that works for environmental conservation and the preservation of endangered species.
<b>intercontinental</b>	Extending or taking place between or among continents. <i><b>Intercontinental</b> flights.</i>
<b><u>international</u></b>	Any of several international socialist organizations. <i>An <b>international</b> agreement.</i>
<b>internationally</b>	In, between, or among many different nations. <i>An <b>internationally</b> renowned artist.</i>
<b>itinerary</b>	An established line of travel or access. <i>His <b>itinerary</b> included an official visit to Canada.</i>
<b>migration</b>	The movement of persons from one country or locality to another. <i>This butterfly's annual <b>migration</b> across North America.</i>
<b>occident</b>	The hemisphere that includes North America and South America.
<b>route</b>	Send via a specific route. <i>Proposals have been put forward for a new <b>route</b> around the south of the town.</i>
<b>southbound</b>	Travelling or leading towards the south. <i>A <b>southbound</b> train.</i>

<b>southward</b>	Toward the south. <i>People began a <b>southward</b> drift.</i>
<b>transcontinental</b>	A transcontinental railway or train. <i>A <b>transcontinental</b> city.</i>
<b>transnational</b>	Extending or operating across national boundaries. <i><b>Transnational</b> terrorist networks.</i>
<b>trip</b>	Make a trip for pleasure. <i>Sammy s gone on a school <b>trip</b>.</i>
<b><u>universal</u></b>	A universal grammatical rule or linguistic feature. <i>Rap enjoys <b>universal</b> appeal among teenage boys.</i>
<b>westward</b>	Toward the west. <i>They traveled <b>westward</b> toward the setting sun.</i>
<b>world</b>	Denoting one of the most important people or things of their class. <i>He was doing his bit to save the <b>world</b>.</i>
<b><u>worldwide</u></b>	Of worldwide scope or applicability Christopher Morley. <i><b>Worldwide</b> distribution.</i>
