<u>extensively</u>	To a large or detailed degree. <i>He has written extensively about the project.</i>
<u>far</u>	Being of a considerable distance or length. <i>The far side of the road.</i>
<u>general</u>	A high rank of officer in the army and in the US air force above lieutenant general and below field marshal general of the army or general of the air force. <i>The general discontent.</i>
generic	(of goods, especially medicinal drugs) having no brand name; not protected by a registered trademark. <i>Is there a generic Asian mind.</i>
<u>global</u>	Relating to or encompassing the whole of something, or of a group of things. <i>Global monetary policy.</i>
globe	Form something into a globe. <i>Goods from all over the globe.</i>
greenpeace	An international organization that works for environmental conservation and the preservation of endangered species.
intercontinental	Extending or taking place between or among continents. <i>Intercontinental flights.</i>
<u>international</u>	Any of several international socialist organizations. <i>An international agreement.</i>
internationally	In, between, or among many different nations. <i>An internationally renowned artist.</i>
itinerary	An established line of travel or access. <i>His itinerary included an official visit to Canada.</i>
migration	The movement of persons from one country or locality to another. <i>This butterfly's annual migration across North America.</i>
occident	The hemisphere that includes North America and South America.
route	Send via a specific route. <i>Proposals have been put forward for a new route around the south of the town.</i>
southbound	Travelling or leading towards the south. <i>A southbound train.</i>

southward	Toward the south. <i>People began a southward drift.</i>
transcontinental	A transcontinental railway or train. <i>A transcontinental city.</i>
transnational	Extending or operating across national boundaries. <i>Transnational terrorist networks.</i>
trip	Make a trip for pleasure. <i>Sammy s gone on a school trip.</i>
<u>universal</u>	A universal grammatical rule or linguistic feature. <i>Rap enjoys universal appeal among teenage boys.</i>
westward	Toward the west. <i>They traveled westward toward the setting sun.</i>
world	Denoting one of the most important people or things of their class. <i>He was doing his bit to save the world.</i>
<u>worldwide</u>	Of worldwide scope or applicability Christopher Morley. <i>Worldwide distribution.</i>
