- audacious** Disposed to venture or take risks.

- bold** A bold typeface or letter.  
*I slapped him when he was **bold**.*
- cartographer** A person who draws or produces maps.  
*A **cartographer** in the British army.*

<b>conquistador</b>	An adventurer (especially one who led the Spanish conquest of Mexico and Peru in the 16th century).
<b>daring</b>	Disposed to venture or take risks. <i>A <b>daring</b> crime.</i>
<b>escapade</b>	A wild and exciting undertaking (not necessarily lawful). <i>He told of their <b>escapade</b> with a borrowed truck.</i>
<b>exploration</b>	The action of exploring an unfamiliar area. <i>He called for a careful <b>exploration</b> of the consequences.</i>
<b>explorer</b>	Someone who travels into little known regions (especially for some scientific purpose). <i>A polar <b>explorer</b>.</i>
<b>frontiersman</b>	A man who lives on the frontier.
<b>geographer</b>	An expert on geography.
<b>immigration</b>	The body of immigrants arriving during a specified interval. <i>A barrier to control illegal <b>immigration</b> from Mexico.</i>
<b>journey</b>	Undertake a journey or trip. <i>An eight hour train <b>journey</b>.</i>
<b>map</b>	Make a map of show or establish the features of details of. <i>The project to <b>map</b> the human genome.</i>
<b>mapping</b>	The process of locating genes on a chromosome.
<b>navigator</b>	The member of an aircrew who is responsible for the aircraft's course. <i>The driver relies on his <b>navigator</b> s skill at reading the road.</i>
<b>nonnative</b>	Of persons born in another area or country than that lived in. <i>Our large <b>nonnative</b> population.</i>
<b>overseas</b>	In a foreign country. <i>He spent quite a lot of time working <b>overseas</b>.</i>
<b>prospector</b>	Someone who explores an area for mineral deposits. <i>I see myself as a <b>prospector</b> of opportunities for my clients.</i>
<b>stranger</b>	Anyone who does not belong in the environment in which they are found. <i>She remained a <b>stranger</b> to him.</i>
<b>tour</b>	Take a performer production etc on tour. <i>He decided to <b>tour</b> France.</i>
<b>tourist</b>	Travel as a tourist. <i>American families <b>touristing</b> abroad.</i>
<b>travel</b>	The action of travelling. <i>He <b>travelled</b> for a wholesale wine firm and had samples of numerous South Tyrolean wines in his case.</i>
