### **adorn**

Furnish with power or authority; of kings or emperors.  
*Flowers **adorned** the tables everywhere.*

### **appreciate**

Rise in value or price.  
*The Germans want to **appreciate** the Deutsche Mark.*

### **beautification**

The act of making something more beautiful.  
*The city commissioned the **beautification** of the tunnel with work by five artists.*

### **belle**

A young woman who is the most charming and beautiful of several rivals.  
*She was the **belle** of the ball.*

### **carat**

A measure of the purity of gold pure gold being 24 carats.  
*A half **carat** diamond ring.*

<b>cherish</b>	Protect and care for (someone) lovingly. <i>I <b>cherish</b> the letters she wrote.</i>
<b>diamond</b>	One of the four suits in a conventional pack of playing cards denoted by a red diamond. <i>He led a small <b>diamond</b>.</i>
<b>fabled</b>	Celebrated in fable or legend. <i>A <b>fabled</b> art collection.</i>
<b>fondly</b>	With foolishly optimistic hope or belief; naively. <i>They <b>fondly</b> believed the cheers were for them.</i>
<b>gem</b>	Decorate with or as with gems. <i>He had the <b>gem</b> set in a ring for his wife.</i>
<b>gemstone</b>	A crystalline rock that can be cut and polished for jewelry.
<b>heirloom</b>	(law) any property that is considered by law or custom as inseparable from an inheritance is inherited with that inheritance. <i>His garden is filled with <b>heirloom</b> vegetables.</i>
<b>invaluable</b>	Having incalculable monetary, intellectual, or spiritual worth. <i>An <b>invaluable</b> source of information.</i>
<b>jade</b>	A semiprecious gemstone that takes a high polish is usually green but sometimes whitish consists of jadeite or nephrite. <i>A silk blouse in a vivid <b>jade</b> green.</i>
<b>jewel</b>	An ornament or piece of jewellery containing a precious stone or stones. <i>She loved dressing up in her <b>jewels</b>.</i>
<b>jewellery</b>	An adornment (as a bracelet or ring or necklace) made of precious metals and set with gems (or imitation gems). <i>She had silver hair and chunky gold <b>jewellery</b>.</i>
<b>jewelry</b>	An adornment (as a bracelet or ring or necklace) made of precious metals and set with gems (or imitation gems).
<b>luxuriously</b>	In an indulgently luxurious manner.
<b>medallion</b>	An oval or circular painting, panel, or design used to decorate a building or textile. <i><b>Medallions</b> of veal.</i>
<b>nephrite</b>	An amphibole mineral consisting of calcium magnesium silicate in monoclinic crystalline form; a source of jade that is less valuable than from jadeite; once believed to cure kidney disorders.
<b>precious</b>	Held in great esteem for admirable qualities especially of an intrinsic nature. <i>Children are <b>precious</b>.</i>

<b>priceless</b>	So precious that its value cannot be determined. <i>Darling you re <b>priceless</b>.</i>
<b>prize</b>	Denoting something for which a prize is awarded. <i>The <b>prize</b> was a free trip to Europe.</i>
<b>rhinestone</b>	An imitation diamond, used in cheap jewellery and to decorate clothes. <i><b>Rhinestone</b> earrings.</i>
<b>valuable</b>	A thing that is of great worth, especially a small item of personal property. <i>A <b>valuable</b> friend.</i>
<b>value</b>	Fix or determine the value of assign a value to. <i>They internalize their parents rules and <b>values</b>.</i>
<b>valued</b>	Considered to be important or beneficial; cherished. <i>Triple <b>valued</b>.</i>
<b>worth</b>	Often used ironically worthy of being treated in a particular way. <i>He admitted stealing 10 000 pounds <b>worth</b> of computer systems.</i>
<b>worthiness</b>	The quality or state of having merit or value. <i>You proved your <b>worthiness</b> as a leader.</i>
<b>worthy</b>	Worthy of being chosen especially as a spouse. <i>These issues are <b>worthy</b> of further consideration.</i>
