<b>advance guard</b>	A tentative suggestion designed to elicit the reactions of others.
<b>avant-garde</b>	Any creative group active in the innovation and application of new concepts and techniques in a given field (especially in the arts).
<b>cutting edge</b>	The act of penetrating or opening open with a sharp edge.
<b>driving force</b>	Hitting a golf ball off of a tee with a driver.
<b>fore</b>	The front part of something, especially a ship.
<b><a href="#">forefront</a></b>	The part in the front or nearest the viewer. <i>He was in the <b>forefront</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">front</a></b>	The part of a garment covering a person s front. <i>The Spartans preserving an even and unbroken <b>front</b>.</i>
<b>front line</b>	The part of something that is nearest to the normal viewer.
<b>front rank</b>	The atmospheric phenomenon created at the boundary between two different air masses.

- lead** A position of being the initiator of something and an example that others will follow especially in the phrase take the lead.  
*The pensions revolution is the **lead** in the Times.*
- leading position** Thin strip of metal used to separate lines of type in printing.
- spearhead** An individual or group chosen to lead an attack or movement.  
*She became the **spearhead** of a health education programme.*
- van** A caravan.  
*He had been watching the marshalling of the fish **vans**.*
