- *A three-note major or minor chord; a note and its third and fifth tones.*
- *A Welsh form of literary composition with an arrangement of subjects or statements in groups of three.*
- *A chord of three musical notes, consisting of a given note with the third and fifth above it.*
- *A group or set of three related people or things.*

<b>trey</b>	A playing card or dice with three spots.
<b>trine</b>	An aspect of 120° (one third of a circle). <i>Venus in <b>trine</b> to Mars.</i>
<b><u>trinity</u></b>	A group of three people or things. <i>The wine was the first of a <b>trinity</b> of three excellent vintages.</i>
<b>trio</b>	The cardinal number that is the sum of one and one and one. <i>The hotel was run by a <b>trio</b> of brothers.</i>
<b><u>triple</u></b>	A thing that is three times as large as usual or is made up of three standard units or items. <i>Two whiskies <b>triples</b> please.</i>
<b>triplet</b>	A group of three associated lines close together in a spectrum or electrophoretic gel. <i>A <b>triplet</b> of aces.</i>
<b>troika</b>	A team of three horses for a troika.

<b>cord</b>	Bind or tie with a cord. <i>He was dressed in faded black <b>CORDS</b>.</i>
<b>double</b>	Do double duty serve two purposes or have two functions. <i>Manchester United won the <b>DOUBLE</b> twice.</i>
<b>five</b>	A playing card or a domino or a die whose upward face shows five pips.
<b>four</b>	A playing card or domino or die whose upward face shows four pips.
<b>foursome</b>	The cardinal number that is the sum of three and one. <i>Wales led 3 2 after the morning <b>foursomes</b>.</i>
<b>fourth</b>	In the fourth place. <i><b>Fourthly</b> you must pay the rent on the first of the month.</i>
<b>hexad</b>	A group or set of six. <i>Each segment down to the tiniest <b>hexad</b> of cilia is practically identical in shape.</i>
<b>leash</b>	Put a leash on a dog. <i>He called Azor to heel so that he could <b>leash</b> him.</i>
<b>million</b>	Denoting a quantity consisting of 1,000,000 items or units. <i>There were <b>millions</b> of flies.</i>
<b>multiple</b>	Having or involving or consisting of more than one part or entity or individual. <i><b>Multiple</b> occupancy.</i>
<b>numeral</b>	A word expressing a number. <i>He learned to write the <b>numerals</b> before he went to school.</i>
<b>one</b>	Being a single entity made by combining separate components. <i>They had lunch at <b>one</b>.</i>
<b>pirouette</b>	Do a pirouette usually as part of a dance. <i>She <b>pirouetted</b> and made a bow.</i>
<b>quadruple</b>	A quadruple number or amount. <i>His stock earning <b>quadrupled</b>.</i>
<b>quartet</b>	A composition for a quartet. <i>A Beethoven <b>quartet</b>.</i>
<b>sextet</b>	A composition for a sextet. <i>The Jazz Club presents a new <b>sextet</b>.</i>
<b>sextuple</b>	Multiply by six; increase sixfold.
<b>six</b>	A playing card or domino or die whose upward face shows six pips.

<b>ternary</b>	Having three units or components or elements. <i>A <b>ternary</b> operation.</i>
<b>tertiary</b>	(chiefly of amines) derived from ammonia by replacement of three hydrogen atoms by organic groups. <i>A Franciscan <b>tertiary</b>.</i>
<b>tether</b>	Tie with a tether. <i>Regulations banning neck and girth <b>tethers</b> for sows.</i>
<b>three</b>	One of four playing cards in a deck having three pips.
<b>tricycle</b>	Ride on a tricycle. <i>A small boy <b>tricycled</b> to the end of his driveway.</i>
<b>trillion</b>	One million million in the United States. <i>In England they call a <b>trillion</b> a billion.</i>
<b>trilogy</b>	A group of three related things. <i>J R R Tolkien's epic fantasy <b>trilogy</b> <i>The Lord of the Rings</i>.</i>
<b>trinity</b>	The union of the Father and Son and Holy Ghost in one Godhead. <i>The wine was the first of a <b>trinity</b> of three excellent vintages.</i>
<b>trio</b>	A group of three musicians. <i>A jazz <b>trio</b>.</i>
<b>triple</b>	Hit a triple. <i><b>Triplex</b> windows.</i>
<b>triplicate</b>	Make three copies of; multiply by three. <i>The <b>triplicate</b> of a letter to the Governor.</i>
<b>triptych</b>	A picture or relief carving on three panels, typically hinged together vertically and used as an altarpiece. <i>A <b>triptych</b> depicting the Crucifixion.</i>
