## Associations of "Tricked" (30 Words)

<b>betray</b>	Expose (one’s country, a group, or a person) to danger by treacherously giving information to an enemy. <i>She drew a deep breath that <b>betrayed</b> her indignation.</i>
<b><u>betrayal</u></b>	An act of deliberate betrayal. <i>These developments represented a <b>betrayal</b> of democracy.</i>
<b>cheat</b>	An act of cheating a fraud or deception. <i>I wish someone had told me my partner was <b>cheating</b> on me.</i>
<b>cheating</b>	A deception for profit to yourself.
<b>cozen</b>	Cheat or trick. <i>He <b>cozened</b> the money out of the old man.</i>
<b><u>deceit</u></b>	The action or practice of deceiving someone by concealing or misrepresenting the truth. <i>A web of <b>deceit</b>.</i>
<b>deceive</b>	Be sexually unfaithful to (one’s regular partner). <i>The area may seem to offer nothing of interest but don t be <b>deceived</b>.</i>
<b>deception</b>	A misleading falsehood. <i>Obtaining property by <b>deception</b>.</i>
<b>defraud</b>	Illegally obtain money from (someone) by deception. <i>She <b>defrauded</b> the customers who trusted her.</i>
<b>delude</b>	Make (someone) believe something that is not true. <i>Too many theorists have <b>deluded</b> the public.</i>
<b>faithless</b>	Having the character of, or characteristic of, a traitor. <i>They were ungodly and <b>faithless</b>.</i>
<b>falsehood</b>	Lying. <i>The right to sue for malicious <b>falsehood</b>.</i>
<b>fraud</b>	A person who makes deceitful pretenses. <i>Prosecutions for social security <b>frauds</b>.</i>

<b>fraudulence</b>	A fraudulent or duplicitous representation.
<b>hoodwink</b>	Influence by slyness. <i>Staff were <b>hoodwinked</b> into thinking the cucumber was a sawn off shotgun.</i>
<b>humbug</b>	A hypocrite. <i>His comments are sheer <b>humbug</b>.</i>
<b>illusion</b>	An instance of a wrong or misinterpreted perception of a sensory experience. <i>He had no <b>illusions</b> about the trouble she was in.</i>
<b>infidelity</b>	The action or state of being unfaithful to a spouse or other sexual partner. <i>Her <b>infidelity</b> continued after her marriage.</i>
<b>legerdemain</b>	Skilful use of one's hands when performing conjuring tricks. <i>A classic piece of management <b>legerdemain</b>.</i>
<b>lie</b>	The way direction or position in which something lies. <i>She <b>lied</b> when she told me she was only 29.</i>
<b>perfidious</b>	Tending to betray; especially having a treacherous character as attributed to the Carthaginians by the Romans. <i>The <b>perfidious</b> Judas.</i>
<b>perfidy</b>	The state of being deceitful and untrustworthy. <i>Hapsburg <b>perfidy</b>.</i>
<b>purposely</b>	With intention; in an intentional manner. <i>She had <b>purposely</b> made it difficult.</i>
<b>scam</b>	A fraudulent business scheme. <i>A guy that <b>scams</b> old pensioners out of their savings.</i>
<b>swindle</b>	The act of swindling by some fraudulent scheme. <i>He is mixed up in a 10 million insurance <b>swindle</b>.</i>
<b>thaumaturgy</b>	Any art that invokes supernatural powers. <i>He attracts people by his <b>thaumaturgy</b>.</i>
<b>traitorous</b>	Relating to or characteristic of a traitor; treacherous. <i>A lying <b>traitorous</b> insurrectionist.</i>
<b>treacherous</b>	Tending to betray especially having a treacherous character as attributed to the Carthaginians by the Romans. <i>A holidaymaker was swept away by <b>treacherous</b> currents.</i>
<b>treachery</b>	Betrayal of a trust. <i>Many died because of his <b>treachery</b>.</i>
<b>untruth</b>	A lie or false statement (often used euphemistically). <i>They go off and tell <b>untruths</b> about organizations for which they worked.</i>
