Associations of "Tricked" (30 Words)

betray	Expose (one's country, a group, or a person) to danger by treacherously giving information to an enemy. <i>She drew a deep breath that betrayed her indignation.</i>
<u>betrayal</u>	An act of deliberate betrayal. <i>These developments represented a betrayal of democracy.</i>
cheat	An act of cheating a fraud or deception. <i>I wish someone had told me my partner was cheating on me.</i>
cheating	A deception for profit to yourself.
cozen	Cheat or trick. <i>He cozened the money out of the old man.</i>
<u>deceit</u>	The action or practice of deceiving someone by concealing or misrepresenting the truth. <i>A web of deceit.</i>
deceive	Be sexually unfaithful to (one's regular partner). <i>The area may seem to offer nothing of interest but don t be deceived.</i>
deception	A misleading falsehood. <i>Obtaining property by deception.</i>
defraud	Illegally obtain money from (someone) by deception. <i>She defrauded the customers who trusted her.</i>
delude	Make (someone) believe something that is not true. <i>Too many theorists have deluded the public.</i>
faithless	Having the character of, or characteristic of, a traitor. <i>They were ungodly and faithless.</i>
falsehood	Lying. <i>The right to sue for malicious falsehood.</i>
fraud	A person who makes deceitful pretenses. <i>Prosecutions for social security frauds.</i>

fraudulence	A fraudulent or duplicitous representation.
hoodwink	Influence by slyness. <i>Staff were hoodwinked into thinking the cucumber was a sawn off shotgun.</i>
humbug	A hypocrite. <i>His comments are sheer humbug.</i>
illusion	An instance of a wrong or misinterpreted perception of a sensory experience. <i>He had no illusions about the trouble she was in.</i>
infidelity	The action or state of being unfaithful to a spouse or other sexual partner. <i>Her infidelity continued after her marriage.</i>
legerdemain	Skilful use of one's hands when performing conjuring tricks. <i>A classic piece of management legerdemain.</i>
lie	The way direction or position in which something lies. <i>She lied when she told me she was only 29.</i>
perfidious	Tending to betray; especially having a treacherous character as attributed to the Carthaginians by the Romans. <i>The perfidious Judas.</i>
perfidy	The state of being deceitful and untrustworthy. <i>Hapsburg perfidy.</i>
purposely	With intention; in an intentional manner. <i>She had purposely made it difficult.</i>
scam	A fraudulent business scheme. <i>A guy that scams old pensioners out of their savings.</i>
swindle	The act of swindling by some fraudulent scheme. <i>He is mixed up in a 10 million insurance swindle.</i>
thaumaturgy	Any art that invokes supernatural powers. <i>He attracts people by his thaumaturgy.</i>
traitorous	Relating to or characteristic of a traitor; treacherous. <i>A lying traitorous insurrectionist.</i>
treacherous	Tending to betray especially having a treacherous character as attributed to the Carthaginians by the Romans. <i>A holidaymaker was swept away by treacherous currents.</i>
treachery	Betrayal of a trust. <i>Many died because of his treachery.</i>
untruth	A lie or false statement (often used euphemistically). <i>They go off and tell untruths about organizations for which they worked.</i>
