Not straightforward or candid; giving a false appearance of frankness-

disingenuous
An ambitious disingenuous philistine and hypocritical operator who

dodgy Marked by skill in deception.

Spurs **dodgy** defence had thrown away a 2 0 lead.

duplicitous (of a charge or plea) containing more than one allegation.

A **duplicitous** philanderer.

Marked by skill in deception.

guileful Marked by skill in deception.

A supremely **quileful** and deceptive politician.

knavish Marked by skill in deception.

His **knavish** tricks will be frustrated.

machiavellian Of or relating to Machiavelli or the principles of conduct he recommended.

. Affording no ease or reassurance.

precarious

Anoromy no ease of reassurar

problematic Making great mental demands; hard to comprehend or solve or believe.

Involving risk or danger.

Their **risky** patter made the guests laugh.

scheming Concealing crafty designs for advancing your own interest.

sensitive Easily damaged, injured, or distressed by slight changes.

slick Made slick by e g ice or grease.

A salesperson may be viewed as a **slick** confidence trickster.

slippery (of a person) evasive and unpredictable; not to be relied on.

wily Marked by skill in deception.


His **wily** opponents.
