Definitions of "Triggers" as a verb

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "triggers" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- Put in motion or move to act.
- Release or pull the trigger on.





Synonyms of "Triggers" as a verb (8 Words)

activate Make (substances) radioactive.

A DNA repair enzyme that is **activate**d by visible light.

- actuate Cause (someone) to act in a particular way; motivate.
- The pendulum **actuate**s an electrical switch.
- **set off** Make ready or suitable or equip in advance for a particular purpose or for some use, event, etc.
- spark Emit sparks of fire or electricity.
- The explosion **spark**ed a fire.
- **spark off** Put in motion or move to act.
- touch off To extend as far as.



trigger off Put in motion or move to act.

tripMake a trip for pleasure.A name which trips off the tongue.

Associations of "Triggers" (30 Words)

breech	Dress a boy in breeches after he had been in petticoats since birth. My second son was breech and my doctor recommended a planned C section.
<u>bullet</u>	Used in similes to refer to someone or something that moves very fast. Your record s bad but it s doubtful they ll give you the bullet .
cannon	Make a cannon. His shot cannon ed off the crossbar.
cartridge	A light-tight supply chamber holding the film and supplying it for exposure as required. <i>He loaded a cartridge of fresh tape into the tape deck.</i>
firearm	A rifle, pistol, or other portable gun. He wore his firearm in a shoulder holster.



firing	The act of firing weapons or artillery at an enemy. The prolonged firing caused heavy losses.
fizz	The quality of being fizzy effervescence. Carbide lamps fizz ed in the darkness.
foam	Become bubbly or frothy or foaming. <i>Venus rising from the foam.</i>
froth	Become bubbly or frothy or foaming. The angry man was froth ing at the mouth.
furor	An interest followed with exaggerated zeal.
glimmer	A flash of light (especially reflected light. He saw a faint glimmer of light from her window.
glint	(of a person's eyes) shine with a particular emotion. <i>Her glasses glinted in the firelight.</i>
<u>gun</u>	Used as a nickname for a ship s gunnery officer. The boom of the one o clock gun echoed across the river.
ignition	The mechanism for bringing about ignition in an internal combustion engine typically activated by a key or switch. <i>She turned off the ignition.</i>
<u>mechanism</u>	(philosophy) the philosophical theory that all phenomena can be explained in terms of physical or biological causes. <i>A mechanism</i> of social control.
musket	An infantryman's light gun with a long barrel, typically smooth-bored and fired from the shoulder. A volley of musket fire.
pistol	Shoot someone with a pistol. When we first met he was a pistol full of ideals and a natural leader.
pull	The act of pulling applying force to move something toward or with you. <i>Pull</i> your knees towards your chin.
pyrotechnics	The craft of making fireworks. <i>He thrilled his audience with vocal pyrotechnics.</i>
rekindle	Arouse again. Rekindle hopes.
rifle	A shoulder firearm with a long barrel and a rifled bore. There are four basic ways to rifle a gun barrel.
<u>shoot</u>	Shoot game over an estate or other area of countryside. Shoot a goal.



shooting	The sport or pastime of shooting with a gun. The shooting of a music video.
shot	A ball of stone or metal used as a missile shot from a large gun or cannon. They have fired the opening shot in what s expected to be a savage price war.
shotgun	Shoot at or kill with a shotgun. A group of us shotgun ned beers.
spark	Emit sparks of fire or electricity. A log fire was sending spark s on to the rug.
<u>sparkle</u>	Merriment expressed by a brightness or gleam or animation of countenance. <i>Her earrings</i> sparkle d as she turned her head.
start	Play in the starting lineup. He got his start because one of the regular pitchers was in the hospital.
tinder	Material for starting a fire. They slashed down the undergrowth for tinder .
<u>twinkle</u>	Emit or reflect light in a flickering manner. There s a perpetual twinkle in his eyes.
