## Trill as a Noun

### Definitions of "Trill" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “trill” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The pronunciation of a consonant, especially r, with rapid vibration of the tongue against the hard or soft palate or the uvula.*
- *A quavering or vibratory sound, especially a rapid alternation of sung or played notes.*
- *The articulation of a consonant (especially the consonant `r') with a rapid flutter of the tongue against the palate or uvula.*
- *A note that alternates rapidly with another note a semitone above it.*





## Synonyms of "Trill" as a noun (25 Words)

- birdsong** The characteristic sound produced by a bird.
- call** A direction in a square dance given by the caller.  
*The pastor s **calls** on his parishioners.*
- calling** The action or sound of calling.  
*The **calling** of a cuckoo.*
- chatter** The rapid series of noises made by the parts of a machine.  
*The starlings constant **chatter**.*
- chattering** The high-pitched continuing noise made by animals (birds or monkeys).
- cheep** A short, high sound resembling the cry of a young bird.  
*An electronic **cheep** from the alarm.*
- chirp** A sharp sound made by small birds or insects.  
*The **chirps** and whirrs of insects.*
- chirping** A sharp sound made by small birds or insects.



<b>chirr</b>	A low trilling sound. <i>The <b>chirr</b> of summer crickets.</i>
<b>chirrup</b>	A short, high-pitched sound. <i>The <b>chirrups</b> of the crickets.</i>
<b>cry</b>	A demand or opinion expressed by many people. <i>He kept a <b>cry</b> of hounds to hunt in the wilderness.</i>
<b>peep</b>	A momentary or partial view of something. <i>Jonathan took a little <b>peep</b> at his watch.</i>
<b>peeping</b>	A secret look.
<b>pipe</b>	The flues and stops on a pipe organ. <i>They were sharing a <b>pipe</b> of tobacco.</i>
<b>pipng</b>	The action or art of playing a pipe or pipes.
<b>shake</b>	A milkshake. <i>I wouldn't go in there it gives me the <b>shakes</b>.</i>
<b>song</b>	A musical composition suggestive of a song. <i>He bought it for a <b>song</b>.</i>
<b>squeak</b>	A single remark or communication. <i>I didn't hear a <b>squeak</b> from him for months.</i>
<b>trilling</b>	United States literary critic (1905-1975).
<b>tweet</b>	A post made on the social media application Twitter. <i>The gentle <b>tweet</b> of a bird can be heard.</i>
<b>twitter</b>	A series of chirps. <i>His words were cut off by a faint electronic <b>twitter</b>.</i>
<b>twittering</b>	A series of chirps.
<b>warbling</b>	A lumpy abscess under the hide of domestic mammals caused by larvae of a botfly or warble fly.
<b>whistle</b>	The act of signalling e.g. summoning by whistling or blowing a whistle. <i>The <b>whistle</b> of the boiling kettle.</i>
<b>whistling</b>	The act of whistling a tune. <i>His cheerful <b>whistling</b> indicated that he enjoyed his work.</i>





## Usage Examples of "Trill" as a noun

- *The caged bird launched into a piercing trill.*
- *He pronounced his R's with a distinct trill.*





## Trill as a Verb

### Definitions of "Trill" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "trill" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Pronounce with a trill, of the phoneme `r.*
- *Produce a quavering or warbling sound.*
- *Sing or play with trills, alternating with the half note above or below.*
- *Pronounce (a consonant) by rapid vibration of the tongue against the hard or soft palate or the uvula.*





## Synonyms of "Trill" as a verb (9 Words)

- cheep** Make high-pitched sounds.  
*Sparrows are **cheeping** all around.*
- chirp** (of a person) say something in a lively and cheerful way.  
*The birds were **chirping** in the bushes.*
- chirrup** (of a small bird) make repeated short, high-pitched sounds.  
*A bird **chirruped** intermittently outside.*
- peep** Speak in a hesitant and high-pitched tone of voice.  
*He **peeped** at the woman through the window.*
- quaver** Give off unsteady sounds, alternating in amplitude or frequency.  
*His voice **quavered** with rage.*
- [sing](#) Deliver by singing.  
*My brother **sings** very well.*
- tweet** Communicate with (someone) on Twitter.  
*She **tweeted** a picture of them smiling at the camera.*



**twitter** Talk rapidly and at length in a trivial way.

*What a great crowd Perry **twittered**.*

**warble** Sing or play with trills, alternating with the half note above or below.

*He **warbled** in an implausible soprano.*

## Usage Examples of "Trill" as a verb

- *Some speakers trill their r's.*
- *Trilling a love ballad, she led him to her chair.*
- *'Coming sir,' they both trilled.*
- *A skylark was trilling overhead.*
