bauble	Something that is superficially attractive but useless or worthless. <i>Clutch bags embellished with glittering baubles.</i>
biblot	A small, decorative ornament or trinket. <i>Bibelots like snuffboxes and jewelled ostrich feather fans.</i>
curio	A rare, unusual, or intriguing object. <i>They had such fun over the wonderful box of curios that Jack had sent from India.</i>
fallal	Cheap showy jewelry or ornament on clothing.
gaud	A showy and purely ornamental thing. <i>Displays of overpriced gauds.</i>
gewgaw	A showy thing, especially one that is useless or worthless. <i>A house full of Victorian gewgaws.</i>

Ornamental objects of no great value.

novelty

A small inexpensive mass-produced article.

*A **novelty** teapot.*

ornament

Something used to beautify.

*Gothic buildings notable for their finely detailed **ornament**.*

piece of bric-a-brac

A separate part of a whole.

toy

An object, especially a gadget or machine, regarded as providing amusement for an adult.

*Private airplanes are a rich man's **toy**.*

trifle

Something of small importance.

*The thousand yen he'd paid seemed the merest **trifle**.*

- accessory** Furnishing added support.
*Functionally the maxillae are a pair of **accessory** jaws.*
- adornment** A thing which adorns or decorates; an ornament.
*Precious stones have been used for the purposes of **adornment** for over 7 000 years.*
- amber** A honey yellow colour typical of amber.
***Amber** eyes.*
- antique** Search or shop for antiques.
*Sanding will change the lustre of the sanded spot especially if the finish has been **antiqued**.*
- bauble** Something that is superficially attractive but useless or worthless.
*People in quest of honours are wasting time and effort to secure **baubles**.*
- beaded** Covered with beads of liquid.
*A **beaded** evening bag.*
- bedeck** Decorate.
*He led us into a room **bedecked** with tinsel.*
- bracelet** An ornamental band, hoop, or chain worn on the wrist or arm.
- bric-a-brac** Miscellaneous curios.
- brooch** Fasten with or as if with a brooch.
- chandelier** A large, decorative hanging light with branches for several light bulbs or candles.
- circlet** Decorated metal band worn around the head.
- decorative** Serving to make something look more attractive; ornamental.
*A well appointed house with original **decorative** features.*
- diamond** A transparent piece of diamond that has been cut and polished and is valued as a precious gem.
*A **diamond** ring.*
- earring** Jewelry to ornament the ear; usually clipped to the earlobe or fastened through a hole in the lobe.
- gem** Decorate with or as with gems.
*A pagoda embellished with precious **gems**.*
- gemstone** A crystalline rock that can be cut and polished for jewelry.
- jade** Of something having the color of jade especially varying from bluish green to yellowish green.
*A **jade** figurine.*
- jewel** A precious or semiprecious stone incorporated into a piece of jewelry.
*She was a **jewel** of a nurse.*

jewellery	An adornment (as a bracelet or ring or necklace) made of precious metals and set with gems (or imitation gems). <i>She had silver hair and chunky gold jewellery.</i>
jewelry	An adornment (as a bracelet or ring or necklace) made of precious metals and set with gems (or imitation gems).
knickknack	A small inexpensive mass-produced article.
medallion	Any of various large ancient Greek coins. <i>Medallions of veal.</i>
necklace	In South Africa kill someone with a tyre necklace. <i>A diamond necklace.</i>
ornament	Be an ornament to. <i>Tables covered with ornaments and books.</i>
ornate	Marked by elaborate rhetoric and elaborated with decorative details. <i>An ornate wrought iron railing.</i>
patina	A green or brown film on the surface of bronze or similar metals, produced by oxidation over a long period. <i>He carries the patina of old money and good breeding.</i>
pearl	Form drops resembling pearls. <i>Sunset pearled the sky above the hills.</i>
pendant	A necklace with a pendant. <i>Decorative pendants may need a special ceiling fitting.</i>
precious	Used as a term of address for a beloved person. <i>Children are precious.</i>
