**trio** (in piquet) a set of three aces, kings, queens, jacks, or tens held in one hand.

*The hotel was run by a **trio** of brothers.*

**triplet** A set or succession of three similar things.  
*The boxer's jab came in **triplets**.*

- triumvirate** A group of three men responsible for public administration or civil authority.  
A **triumvirate** of three executive vice presidents.
- troika** A team of three horses for a troika.

### Definitions of "Triple" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "triple" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Become three times as much or as many.*
- *Hit a three-base hit.*
- *Increase threefold.*
- *Hit a triple.*
- *Multiply by three.*



### **Synonyms of "Triple" as a verb (2 Words)**

**increase by three** Become bigger or greater in amount.

**treble** Sing treble.  
*Rents were doubled and probably **trebled**.*

Having three units or components or elements.  
*Triplex windows.*

<b>one</b>	Being a single entity made by combining separate components. <i>The <b>one</b> and only Muhammad Ali.</i>
<b>pirouette</b>	Do a pirouette usually as part of a dance. <i>She <b>pirouetted</b> and made a bow.</i>
<b>quadruple</b>	A quadruple number or amount. <i>Oil prices <b>quadrupled</b> in the 1970s.</i>
<b>quartet</b>	A composition for a quartet. <i>A Beethoven <b>quartet</b>.</i>
<b>serenade</b>	Entertain someone with a serenade. <i>A strolling guitarist <b>serenades</b> the diners.</i>
<b>sextet</b>	A composition for a sextet. <i>The <b>sextet</b> from <i>The Marriage of Figaro</i>.</i>
<b>sextuple</b>	A sixfold number or amount.
<b>six</b>	A playing card or domino or die whose upward face shows six pips.
<b>sixth</b>	Position six in a countable series of things.
<b>ten</b>	One of four playing cards in a deck with ten pips on the face.
<b>ternary</b>	Using three as a base. <i>A <b>ternary</b> operation.</i>
<b>tertiary</b>	From 63 million to 2 million years ago. <i>The <b>tertiary</b> consumers must hunt for their food.</i>
<b>third</b>	The base that must be touched third by a base runner in baseball. <i>A simple harmony written in major <b>thirds</b>.</i>
<b>thirty</b>	Being ten more than twenty.
<b>three</b>	One of four playing cards in a deck having three pips.
<b>times</b>	A more or less definite period of time now or previously present. <i>You <b>times</b> the six by four to get twenty four.</i>
<b>triad</b>	A Welsh form of literary composition with an arrangement of subjects or statements in groups of three. <i>The <b>triad</b> of medication diet and exercise are necessary in diabetes care.</i>
<b>tricycle</b>	Ride on a tricycle. <i>A small boy <b>tricycled</b> to the end of his driveway.</i>

**trillion** One quintillion in Great Britain.  
*In England they call a quintillion a **trillion**.*

**trinity** The cardinal number that is the sum of one and one and one.  
*The wine was the first of a **trinity** of three excellent vintages.*

**trio** The central, typically contrastive, section of a minuet, scherzo, or march.  
*The hotel was run by a **trio** of brothers.*

**triplicate** Existing in three copies or examples.  
*Titles which have been sparingly ordered can be later duplicated or **triplicated**.*
