trio

(in piquet) a set of three aces, kings, queens, jacks, or tens held in one hand.

*The hotel was run by a **trio** of brothers.*

triplet

A set or succession of three similar things.

*The boxer's jab came in **triplets**.*

triumvirate	A group of three men responsible for public administration or civil authority. A triumvirate of three executive vice presidents.
troika	A team of three horses for a troika.

Definitions of "Triple" as a verb

- *Become three times as much or as many.*

- *Multiply by three.*

increase by three Become bigger or greater in amount.

treble Sing treble.
*Rents were doubled and probably **trebled**.*

foursome	The cardinal number that is the sum of three and one. <i>Wales led 3 2 after the morning foursomes.</i>
fourth	In the fourth place. <i>Fourthly you must pay the rent on the first of the month.</i>

<u>multiple</u>	A shop with branches in many places, especially one selling a specific type of product. <i>15 20 or any multiple of five.</i>

quartet	A composition for a quartet. <i>A Beethoven quartet.</i>
<u>serenade</u>	Entertain someone with a serenade. <i>A strolling guitarist serenades the diners.</i>
sextet	A composition for a sextet. <i>The sextet from <i>The Marriage of Figaro</i>.</i>
sextuple	A sixfold number or amount.
six	A playing card or domino or die whose upward face shows six pips.
sixth	Position six in a countable series of things.
ten	One of four playing cards in a deck with ten pips on the face.
ternary	Using three as a base. <i>A ternary operation.</i>
<u>tertiary</u>	From 63 million to 2 million years ago. <i>The tertiary consumers must hunt for their food.</i>
third	The base that must be touched third by a base runner in baseball. <i>A simple harmony written in major thirds.</i>
thirty	Being ten more than twenty.
<u>three</u>	One of four playing cards in a deck having three pips.
<u>times</u>	A more or less definite period of time now or previously present. <i>You times the six by four to get twenty four.</i>
<u>triad</u>	A Welsh form of literary composition with an arrangement of subjects or statements in groups of three. <i>The triad of medication diet and exercise are necessary in diabetes care.</i>
tricycle	Ride on a tricycle. <i>A small boy tricycled to the end of his driveway.</i>

- trillion** One quintillion in Great Britain.
*In England they call a quintillion a **trillion**.*
- trinity** The cardinal number that is the sum of one and one and one.
*The wine was the first of a **trinity** of three excellent vintages.*
- trio** The central, typically contrastive, section of a minuet, scherzo, or march.
*The hotel was run by a **trio** of brothers.*
- triplicate** Existing in three copies or examples.
*Titles which have been sparingly ordered can be later duplicated or **triplicated**.*
