- joyous** Full of or characterized by joy.
***Joyous** laughter.*

jubilant	Full of high-spirited delight. <i>A large number of jubilant fans ran on to the pitch.</i>
prideful	Having an excessively high opinion of oneself. <i>Walked with a prideful swagger.</i>
proud	Of an event achievement etc causing someone to feel proud. <i>A proud name.</i>
rejoicing	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. <i>Rejoicing crowds filled the streets on VJ Day.</i>
successful	Having achieved fame, wealth, or social status. <i>A successful attack on the town.</i>
triumphal	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. <i>A vast triumphal arch.</i>
victorious	Experiencing triumph. <i>A victorious army.</i>
winning	Very attractive; capturing interest. <i>A winning personality.</i>

- *He couldn't suppress a triumphant smile.*
- *Two of their triumphant Cup team.*

accomplishment	An ability that has been acquired by training. <i>The reduction of inflation was a remarkable accomplishment.</i>
achieve	To gain with effort. <i>The killings achieved nothing.</i>
achievement	The action of accomplishing something. <i>To reach this stage is a great achievement.</i>
acquire	Learn or develop (a skill, habit, or quality). <i>He acquired a reputation for scrupulous honesty.</i>
acquirement	An ability that has been acquired by training. <i>The acquirement of self control.</i>

acquisition	The act of contracting or assuming or acquiring possession of something. <i>The acquisition of wealth.</i>
attain	Succeed in achieving (something that one has worked for). <i>Dolphins can attain speeds in water which man cannot yet emulate.</i>
attainment	The action or fact of achieving a goal towards which one has worked. <i>The attainment of corporate aims.</i>
blowout	An easy victory. <i>You can't do a blowout with super wet hair.</i>
clinch	Fasten a rope or angling line with a clinch knot. <i>Breaking from a clinch he crossed with his right.</i>
competition	Interaction between animal or plant species, or individual organisms, that are attempting to gain a share of a limited environmental resource. <i>He wanted to know what the competition was doing.</i>
delighted	Greatly pleased. <i>We were delighted to see her.</i>
elated	Exultantly proud and joyful; in high spirits. <i>After the concert I felt elated.</i>
exult	To express great joy. <i>Who cannot exult in Spring.</i>
exultant	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. <i>He waved to the exultant crowds.</i>
exultation	A feeling of triumphant elation or jubilation; rejoicing. <i>She laughs in exultation.</i>
feat	A notable achievement. <i>The new printing presses were considerable feats of engineering.</i>
gain	Earn on some commercial or business transaction; earn as salary or wages. <i>She gained 20 pounds when she stopped exercising.</i>
happy	Having a sense of trust and confidence in (a person, arrangement, or situation). <i>I can't say they looked too happy about it but a deal's a deal.</i>
joyful	Feeling, expressing, or causing great pleasure and happiness. <i>Joyful music.</i>
jubilant	Feeling or expressing great happiness and triumph. <i>A large number of jubilant fans ran on to the pitch.</i>

jubilation	A feeling of extreme joy. <i>Unbelievable scenes of jubilation.</i>
rejoice	Used ironically to draw attention to a strange characteristic, especially a name. <i>The guard rejoiced in the name of Blossom.</i>
rejoicing	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. <i>Rejoicing crowds filled the streets on VJ Day.</i>
succeed	Take over a throne, office, or other position from. <i>The management and business skills you need to succeed.</i>
success	An attainment that is successful. <i>Overall the fair was a great success.</i>
triumph	A successful ending of a struggle or contest. <i>The agreement was a triumph for common sense.</i>
victory	An act of defeating an enemy or opponent in a battle, game, or other competition. <i>A narrow victory.</i>
win	Be the winner in a contest or competition be victorious. <i>You will find it difficult to win back their attention.</i>
winner	A person or thing that wins something. <i>Anyone taking out a fixed rate mortgage could be on to a winner.</i>
