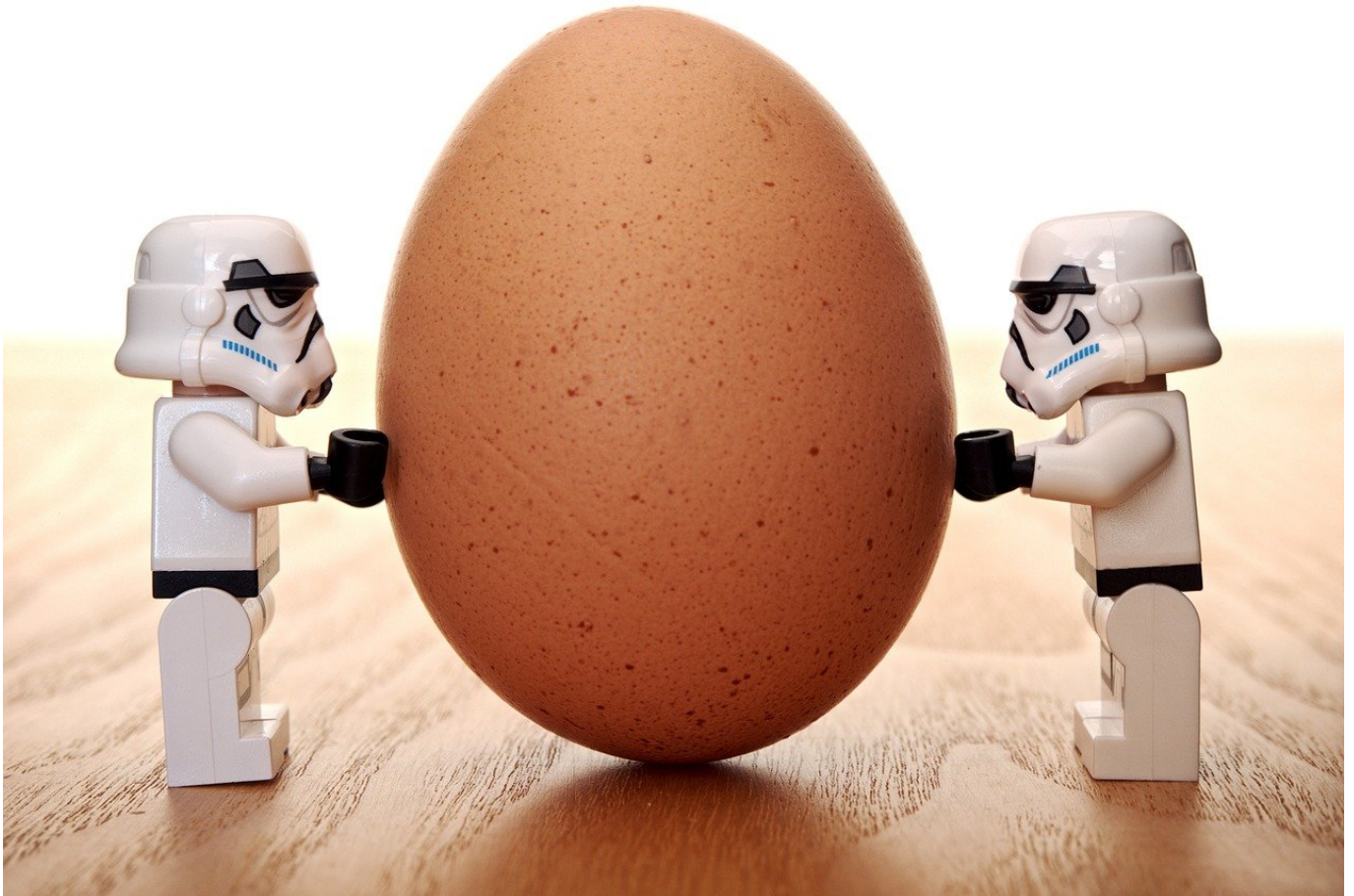

## Synonyms of "Trooper" as a noun (11 Words)

- cavalryman** A soldier mounted on horseback.  
*A **cavalryman** always takes good care of his mount.*
- common soldier** A piece of open land for recreational use in an urban area.
- dc** The district occupied entirely by the city of Washington; chosen by George Washington as the site of the capital of the United States and created out of land ceded by Maryland and Virginia.
- detective** Concerning crime and its investigation.  
*A **detective** inspector.*
- officer of the law** A member of a police force.
- pc** A small digital computer based on a microprocessor and designed to be used by one person at a time.

<b>police officer</b>	The force of policemen and officers.
<b>policeman</b>	A male member of a police force.
<b>policewoman</b>	A woman policeman.
<b>private soldier</b>	An enlisted man of the lowest rank in the Army or Marines.
<b>state trooper</b>	The territory occupied by a nation.
