### Definitions of "Trot" as a noun

- *A gait faster than a walk; diagonally opposite legs strike the ground together.*

- *A slow pace of running.*
- *An act or period of trotting.*

*Bombing **runs** by B52s.*
- trotskyist** Radicals who support Trotsky's theory that socialism must be established throughout the world by continuing revolution.
- trotskyite** Radicals who support Trotsky's theory that socialism must be established throughout the world by continuing revolution.



## Usage Examples of "Trot" as a noun

- *Our horses slowed to a trot.*
- *You might like an early morning trot round the crew deck.*
- *Simpson believes his bad trot is about to end.*
- *She was taking me to the trots.*



## Trot as a Verb

### Definitions of "Trot" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "trot" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *(with reference to a horse or other four-legged animal) proceed or cause to proceed at a pace faster than a walk, lifting each diagonal pair of legs alternately.*

- *Cause to trot.*
- *Run at a moderately swift pace.*
- *(of a person) run at a moderate pace with short steps.*
- *Ride at a trot.*
- *Go or walk briskly.*



### Synonyms of "Trot" as a verb (5 Words)

- clip** Fasten or be fastened with a clip or clips.  
*She **clipped** on a pair of diamond earrings.*
- dogtrot** Move at a dogtrot.  
*They **dogtrotted** back up the path.*
- jog** Run for exercise.  
*They caught and saddled their horses and **jogged** up to the high grass moorland.*
- lope** Run easily.  
*The dog was **loping** along by his side.*

**run**

Be operating running or functioning.  
*He hasn't paid for his drinks **run** and catch him.*



## Usage Examples of "Trot" as a verb

- *The child trotted across to her obediently.*
- *The horses trotted slowly through the night.*
- *She trotted the horse home.*
- *I may trot round to Portobello market for vegetables.*
- *He trotted his horse forward.*
