anxious	(of a situation or period of time) causing or characterized by worry or nervousness. <i>Cast anxious glances behind her.</i>
bothered	Caused to show discomposure. <i>He was trying to play it cool and not look bothered.</i>
concerned	Involved in or affected by or having a claim to or share in. <i>Concerned parents of youthful offenders.</i>
dark	Having a dark hue. <i>Dark eyes.</i>
difficult	Characterized by or causing hardships or problems. <i>A difficult child.</i>
disruptive	Causing or tending to cause disruption. <i>Disruptive pupils.</i>
disturbed	Having the place or position changed. <i>Disturbed grass showed where the horse had passed.</i>
full of problems	Having marked deepness and body.
hard	Unfortunate or hard to bear. <i>Hard liquor.</i>
ill at ease	Affected by an impairment of normal physical or mental function.
perturbed	Feeling anxiety or concern; unsettled. <i>She didn't seem perturbed about the noises around her.</i>
problematic	Open to doubt or debate. <i>If you ever get married which seems to be extremely problematic.</i>
riotous	Having a vivid, varied appearance. <i>A riotous display of bright red green and yellow vegetables.</i>
<u>stressful</u>	Extremely irritating to the nerves. <i>Corporate finance work can be stressful.</i>
<u>tough</u>	Physically toughened. <i>Tough street gangs.</i>
tumultuous	Making an uproar or loud, confused noise. <i>The tumultuous years of his administration.</i>
<u>turbulent</u>	Characterized by conflict, disorder, or confusion; not stable or calm. <i>Her turbulent emotions.</i>
<u>uneasy</u>	Causing or feeling anxiety; troubled or uncomfortable. <i>Gave an uneasy laugh.</i>

unsettled	Not settled or established. <i>An unsettled childhood.</i>
worried	Anxious or troubled about actual or potential problems. <i>Worried parents.</i>

distressed	Suffering severe physical strain or distress. <i>He dropped out of the race clearly distressed and having difficulty breathing.</i>
embarrassed	Having or showing financial difficulties. <i>Too embarrassed to say hello to his drunken father on the street.</i>
engrossed	Giving or marked by complete attention to. <i>That engrossed look or rapt delight.</i>
fraught	Marked by distress. <i>An incident fraught with danger.</i>
harried	Troubled persistently especially with petty annoyances. <i>A harried expression.</i>
insecurity	The state of being open to danger or threat; lack of protection. <i>Growing job insecurity.</i>
irritated	Aroused to impatience or anger. <i>Made an irritated gesture.</i>
nervy	Characterized or produced by apprehension or uncertainty. <i>The nervy feats of mountaineers.</i>
neurotically	In a neurotic manner.
peevish	Easily irritated or annoyed. <i>A thin peevish voice.</i>
preoccupied	Deeply absorbed in thought. <i>A preoccupied frown.</i>
solicitous	Characterized by or showing interest or concern. <i>Solicitous about her health.</i>
steamed	(of food) cooked by steaming. <i>I was steamed.</i>
stressed	Strengthened by the application of stress during manufacture prestressed. <i>An iambic foot consists of an unstressed syllable followed by a stressed syllable as in delay.</i>
tense	Become stretched or tense or taut. <i>Carefully stretch and then tense your muscles.</i>
thoughtful	Taking heed giving close and thoughtful attention. <i>Brows drawn together in thoughtful consideration.</i>
tormented	Tormented or harassed by nightmares or unreasonable fears. <i>Her tormented past.</i>
uneasy	Socially uncomfortable; unsure and constrained in manner. <i>She lived in a state of uneasy truce with her strict father.</i>

upset	The act of upsetting something. <i>The accusation upset her.</i>
<u>uptight</u>	Being in a tense state. <i>He is so uptight about everything.</i>
worried	Anxious or troubled about actual or potential problems. <i>One last worried check of the sleeping children.</i>
