<b>anxious</b>	(of a situation or period of time) causing or characterized by worry or nervousness. <i>Cast <b>anxious</b> glances behind her.</i>
<b>bothered</b>	Caused to show discomposure. <i>He was trying to play it cool and not look <b>bothered</b>.</i>
<b>concerned</b>	Involved in or affected by or having a claim to or share in. <i><b>Concerned</b> parents of youthful offenders.</i>
<b>dark</b>	Having a dark hue. <i><b>Dark</b> eyes.</i>
<b>difficult</b>	Characterized by or causing hardships or problems. <i>A <b>difficult</b> child.</i>
<b>disruptive</b>	Causing or tending to cause disruption. <i><b>Disruptive</b> pupils.</i>

<b>full of problems</b>	Having marked deepness and body.
<b>hard</b>	Unfortunate or hard to bear. <i><b>Hard</b> liquor.</i>
<b>ill at ease</b>	Affected by an impairment of normal physical or mental function.
<b>perturbed</b>	Feeling anxiety or concern; unsettled. <i>She didn't seem <b>perturbed</b> about the noises around her.</i>
<b>problematic</b>	Open to doubt or debate. <i>If you ever get married which seems to be extremely <b>problematic</b>.</i>
<b>riotous</b>	Having a vivid, varied appearance. <i>A <b>riotous</b> display of bright red green and yellow vegetables.</i>
<u><b>stressful</b></u>	Extremely irritating to the nerves. <i>Corporate finance work can be <b>stressful</b>.</i>
<u><b>tough</b></u>	Physically toughened. <i><b>Tough</b> street gangs.</i>
<b>tumultuous</b>	Making an uproar or loud, confused noise. <i>The <b>tumultuous</b> years of his administration.</i>
<u><b>turbulent</b></u>	Characterized by conflict, disorder, or confusion; not stable or calm. <i>Her <b>turbulent</b> emotions.</i>
<u><b>uneasy</b></u>	Causing or feeling anxiety; troubled or uncomfortable. <i>Gave an <b>uneasy</b> laugh.</i>

<b>unsettled</b>	Not settled or established. <i>An <b>unsettled</b> childhood.</i>
<b>worried</b>	Anxious or troubled about actual or potential problems. <i><b>Worried</b> parents.</i>

<b>absorbed</b>	(of energy or a liquid or other substance) taken in or soaked up. <i>The <b>absorbed</b> light intensity.</i>
<b>anguished</b>	Experiencing intense pain especially mental pain. <i>An <b>anguished</b> conscience.</i>
<b>annoyed</b>	Aroused to impatience or anger. <i>Kelly was <b>annoyed</b> with him.</i>
<b>anxiety</b>	Strong desire or concern to do something or for something to happen. <i>The housekeeper's eager <b>anxiety</b> to please.</i>
<b>anxious</b>	(of a situation or period of time) causing or characterized by worry or nervousness. <i>My parents were <b>anxious</b> that I get an education.</i>
<b><u>apprehensive</u></b>	Quick to understand- Nathaniel Hawthorne. <i><b>Apprehensive</b> for one's life.</i>
<b>bother</b>	(of a circumstance or event) worry, disturb, or upset (someone). <i>The mere thought of her <b>bothered</b> him and made his heart beat faster.</i>
<b>concerned</b>	Feeling or showing worry or solicitude. <i>We feel <b>concerned</b> about accomplishing the task at hand.</i>
<b><u>cowardice</u></b>	The trait of lacking courage. <i>My <b>cowardice</b> got the better of me and I crept out of the room.</i>

<b>distressed</b>	Suffering severe physical strain or distress. <i>He dropped out of the race clearly <b>distressed</b> and having difficulty breathing.</i>
<b><u>embarrassed</u></b>	Having or showing financial difficulties. <i>Too <b>embarrassed</b> to say hello to his drunken father on the street.</i>
<b><u>engrossed</u></b>	Giving or marked by complete attention to. <i>That <b>engrossed</b> look or rapt delight.</i>
<b>fraught</b>	Marked by distress. <i>An incident <b>fraught</b> with danger.</i>
<b>harried</b>	Troubled persistently especially with petty annoyances. <i>A <b>harried</b> expression.</i>
<b><u>insecurity</u></b>	The state of being open to danger or threat; lack of protection. <i>Growing job <b>insecurity</b>.</i>
<b>irritated</b>	Aroused to impatience or anger. <i>Made an <b>irritated</b> gesture.</i>
<b>nervy</b>	Characterized or produced by apprehension or uncertainty. <i>The <b>nervy</b> feats of mountaineers.</i>
<b>neurotically</b>	In a neurotic manner.
<b>peevish</b>	Easily irritated or annoyed. <i>A thin <b>peevish</b> voice.</i>
<b><u>preoccupied</u></b>	Deeply absorbed in thought. <i>A <b>preoccupied</b> frown.</i>
<b>solicitous</b>	Characterized by or showing interest or concern. <i><b>Solicitous</b> about her health.</i>
<b>steamed</b>	(of food) cooked by steaming. <i>I was <b>steamed</b>.</i>
<b>stressed</b>	Strengthened by the application of stress during manufacture prestressed. <i>An iambic foot consists of an <b>unstressed</b> syllable followed by a <b>stressed</b> syllable as in delay.</i>
<b><u>tense</u></b>	Become stretched or tense or taut. <i>Carefully stretch and then <b>tense</b> your muscles.</i>
<b>thoughtful</b>	Taking heed giving close and thoughtful attention. <i>Brows drawn together in <b>thoughtful</b> consideration.</i>
<b>tormented</b>	Tormented or harassed by nightmares or unreasonable fears. <i>Her <b>tormented</b> past.</i>
<b><u>uneasy</u></b>	Socially uncomfortable; unsure and constrained in manner. <i>She lived in a state of <b>uneasy</b> truce with her strict father.</i>

Being in a tense state.

*He is so **uptight** about everything.*

**worried**

Anxious or troubled about actual or potential problems.

*One last **worried** check of the sleeping children.*
