## Truck as a Noun

### Definitions of "Truck" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “truck” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A wooden disc at the top of a ship's mast or flagstaff, with holes for halyards to slide through.*
- *Each of two axle units on a skateboard, to which the wheels are attached.*
- *A handcart that has a frame with two low wheels and a ledge at the bottom and handles at the top; used to move crates or other heavy objects.*
- *A railway bogie.*
- *A large, heavy road vehicle used for carrying goods, materials, or troops; a lorry.*
- *A low flat-topped trolley used for moving heavy items.*
- *An automotive vehicle suitable for hauling.*
- *A railway vehicle for carrying freight, especially a small open one.*



## Synonyms of "Truck" as a noun (4 Words)

- hand truck** A unit of length equal to 4 inches; used in measuring horses.
- heavy goods vehicle** A serious (or tragic) role in a play.
- juggernaut** An avatar of Vishnu.  
*The **juggernaut** of public expenditure.*
- motortruck** An automotive vehicle suitable for hauling.

<b>automobile</b>	Travel in an automobile.
<b>axle</b>	A rod or spindle (either fixed or rotating) passing through the centre of a wheel or group of wheels. <i><b>Axle</b> grease.</i>
<b>bicycle</b>	Ride a bicycle. <i>They spent the holidays bicycling around the beautiful Devonshire countryside.</i>
<b>bus</b>	Send or move around by bus. <i>The priest <b>bussed</b> in from a neighbouring parish.</i>
<b>cab</b>	Ride in a taxicab. <i><b>Cab</b> drivers.</i>
<b>cart</b>	Transport something in a cart. <i>My mother <b>carted</b> us around from one activity to another.</i>

<b><u>chauffeur</u></b>	Drive someone in a vehicle. <i>She insisted on being <b>chauffeured</b> around.</i>
<b>crane</b>	Move a heavy object with a crane. <i>The opening <b>crane</b> shot.</i>
<b><u>cycle</u></b>	Pass through a cycle. <i>Economies <b>cycle</b> regularly between boom and slump.</i>
<b>cyclist</b>	A person who rides a bicycle.
<b><u>drive</u></b>	Work as a driver. <i>The riverside <b>drive</b> offers many exciting scenic views.</i>
<b><u>driver</u></b>	A golfer who hits the golf ball with a driver. <i>A taxi <b>driver</b>.</i>
<b><u>fare</u></b>	The sum charged for riding in a public conveyance. <i>Those expecting conventional Hollywood <b>fare</b> will be disappointed.</i>
<b><u>laden</u></b>	Remove with or as if with a ladle. <i>The moisture <b>laden</b> air.</i>
<b>limousine</b>	A passenger vehicle carrying people to and from an airport. <i>The Prince was whisked away in a black <b>limousine</b>.</i>
<b>loaded</b>	(of a firearm) charged with ammunition. <i>A <b>loaded</b> gun.</i>
<b>motorist</b>	Someone who drives (or travels in) an automobile.
<b>pallet</b>	A mattress filled with straw or a pad made of quilts; used as a bed.
<b>pantehnicon</b>	A large van for transporting furniture.
<b>pedal</b>	Move by working the pedals of a bicycle. <i>A brake <b>pedal</b>.</i>
<b>pickup</b>	A small van or truck with low sides. <i>Travel by coach from your local <b>pickup</b> point to your hotel.</i>
<b><u>ride</u></b>	Ride over along or through. <i>The <b>ride</b> is comfortable though there is a slight roll when cornering.</i>
<b><u>spoke</u></b>	One of the crosspieces that form the steps of a ladder.
<b>taxi</b>	Ride in a taxicab. <i>He <b>taxied</b> the plane to the very end of the airstrip.</i>
<b>tram</b>	Travel by tram. <i>A <b>tramcar</b> carries coal out of a coal mine.</i>
<b>trucker</b>	Someone who drives a truck as an occupation.
<b>tumbrel</b>	A farm dumpcart for carrying dung; carts of this type were used to carry prisoners to the guillotine during the French Revolution.

A caravan.  
A **van** driver.

**vehicle**

A substance that facilitates the use of a drug, pigment, or other material mixed with it.

*Casein was used as a **vehicle** for pigments by the medieval painters.*

**wheel**

A thing resembling a wheel in particular a cheese made in the form of a shallow disc.

*A small **wheel** of Brie.*
