Definitions of "Truck" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “truck” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A wooden disc at the top of a ship's mast or flagstaff, with holes for halyards to slide through.*
- *Each of two axle units on a skateboard, to which the wheels are attached.*
- *A handcart that has a frame with two low wheels and a ledge at the bottom and handles at the top; used to move crates or other heavy objects.*
- *A railway bogie.*
- *A large, heavy road vehicle used for carrying goods, materials, or troops; a lorry.*
- *A low flat-topped trolley used for moving heavy items.*
- *An automotive vehicle suitable for hauling.*
- *A railway vehicle for carrying freight, especially a small open one.*



Synonyms of "Truck" as a noun (4 Words)

- hand truck** A unit of length equal to 4 inches; used in measuring horses.
- heavy goods vehicle** A serious (or tragic) role in a play.
- juggernaut** An avatar of Vishnu.
*The **juggernaut** of public expenditure.*
- motortruck** An automotive vehicle suitable for hauling.



Associations of "Truck" (30 Words)

automobile	Travel in an automobile.
axle	A rod or spindle (either fixed or rotating) passing through the centre of a wheel or group of wheels. <i>Axle grease.</i>
bicycle	Ride a bicycle. <i>They spent the holidays bicycling around the beautiful Devonshire countryside.</i>
bus	Send or move around by bus. <i>The priest bussed in from a neighbouring parish.</i>
cab	Ride in a taxicab. <i>Cab drivers.</i>
cart	Transport something in a cart. <i>My mother carted us around from one activity to another.</i>

<u>chauffeur</u>	Drive someone in a vehicle. <i>She insisted on being chauffeured around.</i>
crane	Move a heavy object with a crane. <i>The opening crane shot.</i>
<u>cycle</u>	Pass through a cycle. <i>Economies cycle regularly between boom and slump.</i>
cyclist	A person who rides a bicycle.
<u>drive</u>	Work as a driver. <i>The riverside drive offers many exciting scenic views.</i>
<u>driver</u>	A golfer who hits the golf ball with a driver. <i>A taxi driver.</i>
<u>fare</u>	The sum charged for riding in a public conveyance. <i>Those expecting conventional Hollywood fare will be disappointed.</i>
<u>laden</u>	Remove with or as if with a ladle. <i>The moisture laden air.</i>
limousine	A passenger vehicle carrying people to and from an airport. <i>The Prince was whisked away in a black limousine.</i>
loaded	(of a firearm) charged with ammunition. <i>A loaded gun.</i>
motorist	Someone who drives (or travels in) an automobile.
pallet	A mattress filled with straw or a pad made of quilts; used as a bed.
pantehnicon	A large van for transporting furniture.
pedal	Move by working the pedals of a bicycle. <i>A brake pedal.</i>
pickup	A small van or truck with low sides. <i>Travel by coach from your local pickup point to your hotel.</i>
<u>ride</u>	Ride over along or through. <i>The ride is comfortable though there is a slight roll when cornering.</i>
<u>spoke</u>	One of the crosspieces that form the steps of a ladder.
taxi	Ride in a taxicab. <i>He taxied the plane to the very end of the airstrip.</i>
tram	Travel by tram. <i>A tramcar carries coal out of a coal mine.</i>
trucker	Someone who drives a truck as an occupation.
tumbrel	A farm dumpcart for carrying dung; carts of this type were used to carry prisoners to the guillotine during the French Revolution.

van

A caravan.
A **van** driver.

vehicle

A substance that facilitates the use of a drug, pigment, or other material mixed with it.

*Casein was used as a **vehicle** for pigments by the medieval painters.*

wheel

A thing resembling a wheel in particular a cheese made in the form of a shallow disc.

*A small **wheel** of Brie.*
