<b>aggressive</b>	Ready or likely to attack or confront; characterized by or resulting from aggression. <i>Aggressive drivers.</i>
<b>antagonistic</b>	Arousing animosity or hostility. <i>His antagonistic brusqueness.</i>
<b><a href="#">argumentative</a></b>	Using or characterized by systematic reasoning. <i>Argumentative to the point of being cantankerous.</i>
<b>bellicose</b>	Demonstrating aggression and willingness to fight. <i>Bellicose young officers.</i>

<b>belligerent</b>	Hostile and aggressive. <i>The mood at the meeting was <b>belligerent</b>.</i>
<b>combative</b>	Ready or eager to fight or argue. <i>He made some enemies with his <b>combative</b> style.</i>
<b>confrontational</b>	Of or relating to confrontation. <i>He distanced himself from the <b>confrontational</b> approach adopted by his predecessor.</i>
<b>contentious</b>	Causing or likely to cause an argument; controversial. <i>A central and <b>contentious</b> element of the book.</i>
<b>defiant</b>	Boldly resisting authority or an opposing force. <i>Brought up to be aggressive and <b>defiant</b>.</i>
<b>hostile</b>	Very unfavorable to life or growth. <i><b>Hostile</b> tender offer.</i>
<b>obstreperous</b>	Noisy and difficult to control. <i>Kept up an <b>obstreperous</b> clamor.</i>
<b>pugnacious</b>	Ready and able to resort to force or violence. <i><b>Pugnacious</b> spirits lamented that there was so little prospect of an exhilarating disturbance.</i>
<b>quarrelsome</b>	Given to quarreling. <i><b>Quarrelsome</b> when drinking.</i>
<b>ready for a fight</b>	Immediately available.
<b>uncooperative</b>	Unwilling to help others or do what they ask. <i>An <b>uncooperative</b> witness.</i>

- *The truculent attitude of farmers to cheaper imports.*

<b>cruel</b>	Wilfully causing pain or suffering to others, or feeling no concern about it. <i>A <b>cruel</b> remark.</i>
<b>fell</b>	The act of felling something as a tree.
<b>ferocious</b>	Very great; extreme. <i>A <b>ferocious</b> beast.</i>
<b>ferocity</b>	The state or quality of being ferocious. <i>The <b>ferocity</b> of the storm caught them by surprise.</i>
<b>fierce</b>	(of a mechanism) having a jolting and powerful abruptness of action. <i><b>Fierce</b> loyalty.</i>
<b>furious</b>	Marked by extreme anger. <i>A <b>furious</b> battle.</i>
<b>gory</b>	Accompanied by bloodshed. <i>A <b>gory</b> horror film.</i>
<b>gusty</b>	Characterized by or blowing in gusts. <i><b>Gusty</b> female vocals.</i>
<b>heinous</b>	Extremely wicked, deeply criminal. <i><b>Heinous</b> accusations.</i>
<b>inhuman</b>	Not human in nature or character. <i>A babel of <b>inhuman</b> noises.</i>
<b>inhumane</b>	Lacking and reflecting lack of pity or compassion. <i>Biological weapons are considered too <b>inhumane</b> to be used.</i>
<b>pitiless</b>	(especially of weather) unrelentingly harsh or severe. <i>A night of <b>pitiless</b> rain.</i>
<b>rampage</b>	A period of violent and uncontrollable behaviour by a group of people. <i>Youths went on the <b>rampage</b> and wrecked a classroom.</i>
<b>ruthless</b>	Having or showing no pity or compassion for others. <i>A <b>ruthless</b> manipulator.</i>

<b>sadistic</b>	Deriving pleasure from inflicting pain, suffering, or humiliation on others. <i>A <b>sadistic</b> killer.</i>
<b>sanguinary</b>	Involving or causing much bloodshed. <i>This bitter and <b>sanguinary</b> war.</i>
<b>savage</b>	(of persons or their actions) able or disposed to inflict pain or suffering. <i>A <b>savage</b> slap.</i>
<b>truculence</b>	Obstreperous and defiant aggressiveness.
<b>tussle</b>	Fight or struggle in a confused way at close quarters. <i>The demonstrators <b>tussled</b> with police.</i>
<b><u>vehement</u></b>	Marked by extreme intensity of emotions or convictions; inclined to react violently; fervid. <i>Her voice was low but <b>vehement</b>.</i>
<b>vicious</b>	(of language or a line of reasoning) imperfect; defective. <i><b>Vicious</b> gossip.</i>
<b>violent</b>	Marked by extreme intensity of emotions or convictions inclined to react violently fervid. <i>A <b>violent</b> rage.</i>
