## Trump as a Noun

### Definitions of "Trump" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “trump” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A valuable resource that may be used, especially as a surprise, in order to gain an advantage.*
- *The suit that has been declared to rank above all other suits for the duration of the hand.*
- *(in a tarot pack) any of a special suit of 22 cards depicting symbolic and typical figures and scenes.*
- *(card games) the suit that has been declared to rank above all other suits for the duration of the hand.*
- *(in bridge, whist, and similar card games) a playing card of the suit chosen to rank above the others, which can win a trick where a card of a different suit has been led.*
- *The suit of cards ranking above the others in a particular hand.*
- *A brass musical instrument with a brilliant tone; has a narrow tube and a flared bell*

*and is played by means of valves.*

- *A playing card in the suit that has been declared trumps.*
- *A helpful or admirable person.*



## Synonyms of "Trump" as a noun (4 Words)

- cornet** A brass musical instrument with a brilliant tone; has a narrow tube and a flared bell and is played by means of valves.
- horn** A pair of horns as an emblem of a cuckold.  
*She took endless **horn** and pressure but now she wants a divorce.*
- trump card** A printed or written greeting that is left to indicate that you have visited.

**trumpet**

An organ reed stop with a quality resembling that of a trumpet.  
*His voice blazed to a **trumpet** in his indignation.*



**Usage Examples of "Trump" as a noun**

- *Declarer ruffs the opening lead and plays a trump.*
- *Clubs were declared trumps.*
- *The ace of trumps is a sure winner.*
- *In this month General Haig decided to play his trump card: the tank.*
- *A trump can take a trick even when a card of a different suit is led.*
- *The ace of trumps.*
- *Spencer's doctor is a trump—I am like a new man.*





## Trump as a Verb

### Definitions of "Trump" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](https://www.oxforddictionaries.com/definition/trump), "trump" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Produce a sound as if from a trumpet.*
- *(in bridge, whist, and similar card games) play a trump on (a card of another suit).*
- *Proclaim or announce with or as if with a fanfare.*
- *Play a trump.*
- *Get the better of.*
- *Surpass (something) by saying or doing something better.*



## Synonyms of "Trump" as a verb (13 Words)

<b>best</b>	Outwit or get the better of (someone). <i>She refused to allow herself to be <b>bested</b>.</i>
<b><u>eclipse</u></b>	Cause an eclipse of a celestial body by intervention. <i>The economy has <b>eclipsed</b> the environment as the main issue.</i>
<b>outclass</b>	Cause to appear in a lower class. <i>Villa totally <b>outclassed</b> us in the first half.</i>
<b>outdo</b>	Get the better of. <i>The men tried to <b>outdo</b> each other in their generosity.</i>
<b>outflank</b>	Outwit. <i>The Germans had sought to <b>outflank</b> them from the north east.</i>
<b>outperform</b>	Be or do something to a greater degree. <i>An experienced employee will <b>outperform</b> the novice.</i>
<b>outshine</b>	Shine brighter than. <i>What star <b>outshines</b> the sun.</i>

**put in the shade** Estimate.

**ruff** Play a trump.

**scoop** Pick up and move something with a scoop.  
*A hole was **scooped** out in the floor of the dwelling.*

**surpass** Distinguish oneself.  
*The organist was **surpassing** himself.*

**trump out** Reveal (something) about somebody's identity or lifestyle.

**upstage** Move upstage forcing the other actors to turn away from the audience.  
*When he tried to **upstage** her she sauntered down to the front of the stage.*



## Usage Examples of "Trump" as a verb

- *Taste trumps most if not all other factors when consumers choose food products.*
- *Why on earth did you trump my ace?*
- *If he trumped with the 6 or 10, the opponents could overruff.*



- *Declarer trumped the last losing spade in dummy.*
