

dependable	Financially safe. A dependable worker.
<u>ethical</u>	Adhering to ethical and moral principles. Had no ethical objection to drinking.
full of integrity	Having ample fabric.
<u>honest</u>	Not disposed to cheat or defraud; not deceptive or fraudulent. <i>He s struggling to make an</i> honest <i>living.</i>
honourable	Adhering to ethical and moral principles. <i>This is the only honourable course.</i>
incorruptible	Not subject to death or decay; everlasting. <i>Incorruptible</i> judges are the backbone of the society.



principled	(of a system or method) based on a given set of rules. A coherent and principled approach.
reliable	Worthy of being depended on. A reliable source of information.
true	Of a compass bearing measured relative to true north. <i>He was true to his word</i> .
trusty	Having served for a long time and regarded as reliable or faithful. My trusty old Morris Minor.
truthful	(of artistic or literary representation) characterized by accuracy or realism; true to life. <i>Gave truthful testimony.</i>
unimpeachable	Beyond doubt or reproach. An unimpeachable witness.
upright	Upright in position or posture. An upright and respectable man.
<u>virtuous</u>	Having or showing high moral standards. She considered herself very virtuous because she neither drank nor smoked.
worthy of trust	Having worth or merit or value; being honorable or admirable.






Usage Examples of "Trustworthy" as an adjective

accuracy	The number of significant figures given in a number. We have confidence in the accuracy of the statistics.
belief	Something one accepts as true or real; a firmly held opinion A belief in democratic politics.
<u>believable</u>	Able to be believed; credible. <i>She felt that Dawn s story was not quite believable.</i>
believe	Follow a credo have a faith be a believer. The deal is believe d to be worth around 15 million.
believing	The cognitive process that leads to convictions. <i>Seeing is believing</i> .
confiding	Willing to entrust personal matters. First she was suspicious then she became confiding .



credibility	The quality of being trusted and believed in. The book s anecdotes have scant regard for credibility .
<u>credible</u>	Credulous. She was not the credible fool he expected.
<u>credulity</u>	A tendency to be too ready to believe that something is real or true. Moneylenders prey upon their credulity and inexperience.
credulous	Having or showing too great a readiness to believe things. The gimmick would convince none but the most credulous .
dependable	Financially sound. A dependable worker.
<u>faith</u>	A particular religion. He lost his faith but not his morality.
<u>faithful</u>	Those who are faithful to a particular religion or political party. A faithful copy of the portrait.
faithfully	In a loyal manner. It always came on faithfully like the radio.
<u>gullible</u>	Easily persuaded to believe something; credulous. <i>Gullible</i> tourists taken in by the shell game.
<u>honorable</u>	Adhering to ethical and moral principles. An honorable man.
integrity	The quality of being honest and having strong moral principles. <i>Upholding territorial integrity and national sovereignty.</i>
<u>loyal</u>	Inspired by love for your country. <i>Loyal friends stood by him.</i>
plausible	Given to or characterized by presenting specious arguments. <i>A plausible excuse.</i>
reliability	The quality of being dependable or reliable. <i>The car s background gives me every confidence in its reliability.</i>
reliable	A reliable person or thing. <i>Reliable</i> information.
<u>sincerity</u>	The trait of being serious. The simple sincerity of folk songs.
stanch	Stop the flow of a liquid.
trust	Confer a trust upon. A trust was set up.
<u>trusted</u>	Regarded as reliable or truthful. A trusted adviser.



trustful	Inclined to believe or confide readily; full of trust. A trustful acceptance of authority.
trusting	Showing or tending to have a belief in a person's honesty or sincerity; not suspicious. <i>A shy and trusting child.</i>
truthful	Conforming to truth. A truthful person.
<u>truthfulness</u>	The quality of being truthful. We have had to judge the truthfulness of the evidence.
verisimilitude	The appearance of being true or real. The detail gives the novel some verisimilitude .
