Associations of "Truthfully" (30 Words)

accepting	Tolerating without protest. <i>The atmosphere was judged to be more supporting and accepting.</i>
<u>accountable</u>	Required or expected to justify actions or decisions; responsible. <i>Fully accountable for what they did.</i>
bluntly	In a blunt direct manner. <i>He spoke bluntly.</i>
<u>candid</u>	Truthful and straightforward; frank. <i>It is better to let the photographer mingle among the guests and take candid shots.</i>
<u>courtesy</u>	A courteous manner. <i>He treated the players with courtesy and good humour.</i>
<u>decent</u>	Decently clothed. <i>I would kill for a decent cup of coffee.</i>
downright	Complete and without restriction or qualification; sometimes used informally as intensifiers. <i>A downright lie.</i>
fair	Without favoring one party in a fair evenhanded manner. <i>He hit a fair ball over the third base bag.</i>
frank	Exempt by means of an official pass or letter, as from customs or other checks. <i>A long and frank discussion.</i>
<u>honest</u>	Used to persuade someone of the truth of something. <i>My honest opinion.</i>
<u>honesty</u>	Referring to or using a way of charging for goods or services that relies on the customers to leave money in an unattended receptacle even though there is no one to collect their payments. <i>They spoke with convincing honesty about their fears.</i>

humble	(of a thing) of modest pretensions or dimensions. <i>A humble apology.</i>
innocence	A state or condition of being innocent of a specific crime or offense. <i>The trial established his innocence.</i>
integrity	The condition of being unified or sound in construction. <i>The integrity of the nervous system is required for normal development.</i>
<u>openness</u>	Lack of secrecy or concealment; frankness. <i>It is the openness to possibilities that creates great research.</i>
<u>outspoken</u>	Frank in stating one's opinions, especially if they are shocking or controversial. <i>It is possible to be outspoken without being rude.</i>
righteousness	Adhering to moral principles. <i>We had little doubt about the righteousness of our cause.</i>
scrupulous	Having scruples; arising from a sense of right and wrong; principled. <i>She is too scrupulous to have an affair with a married man.</i>
<u>sheer</u>	Cause to sheer. <i>She sheered her car around the obstacle.</i>
<u>sincere</u>	(of a person) saying what they genuinely feel or believe; not dishonest or hypocritical. <i>They offer their sincere thanks to Paul.</i>
<u>sincerity</u>	An earnest and sincere feeling. <i>His sincerity inspired belief.</i>
<u>straight</u>	A straight segment of a roadway or racecourse. <i>I'm so tired I can hardly think straight.</i>
straightforwardness	Without hypocrisy. <i>What some people take for rudeness is really straightforwardness.</i>
straightness	Trueness of course toward a goal.
<u>trustworthy</u>	Taking responsibility for one's conduct and obligations. <i>An experienced and trustworthy traveling companion.</i>
<u>truthfulness</u>	The fact of being realistic or true to life; realism. <i>The truthfulness of her playing of an ageing American spinster.</i>
<u>unassuming</u>	Not pretentious or arrogant; modest. <i>He was an unassuming and kindly man.</i>
unbiased	Characterized by a lack of partiality. <i>His assessment of the benefits and drawbacks was unbiased.</i>

Exhibiting restrained good taste.

*In spite of his fame he was thoroughly **unpretentious**.*

veracious

Habitually speaking the truth.

*A **veracious** witness.*
