humble (of a thing) of modest pretensions or dimensions.

A **humble** apology.

innocence A state or condition of being innocent of a specific crime or offense.

The trial established his **innocence**.

The condition of being unified or sound in construction.

integrity The **integrity** of the nervous system is required for normal

development.

Lack of secrecy or concealment; frankness.

It is the **openness** to possibilities that creates great research.

Frank in stating one's opinions, especially if they are shocking or

<u>outspoken</u> controversial.

It is possible to be **outspoken** without being rude.

righteousness Adhering to moral principles.

We had little doubt about the **righteousness** of our cause.

Having scruples; arising from a sense of right and wrong;

scrupulous principled.

She s too **scrupulous** to have an affair with a married man.

Cause to sheer.
