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Associations of "Try out" (30 Words)

essay	A written report of the results of an analysis of the composition of some substance. <i>They made an essay of the contents.</i>
assiduity	Constant attentions to someone. <i>The assiduity with which he could wear down his opponents.</i>
attempt	Make an effort or attempt. <i>An attempt to halt the bombings.</i>
conscientiously	In a way that is motivated by one's moral sense of right and wrong. <i>He applied himself conscientiously to his profession.</i>
contend	Have an argument about something. <i>Militant groups are contending for control of the country.</i>
contribute	Contribute to some cause. <i>He contributed to a private pension.</i>
effort	A notable achievement. <i>He got an A for effort.</i>
endeavor	Attempt by employing effort. <i>We endeavor to make our customers happy.</i>
endeavour	Earnest, prolonged, and industrious effort. <i>He is endeavouring to help the Third World.</i>
exertion	The application of a force, influence, or quality. <i>They managed only with great exertion.</i>
exhale	Give out (breath or an odor). <i>He exhaled the smoke towards the ceiling.</i>
filibuster	Obstruct proposed legislation with a filibuster. <i>The bill was defeated by a Senate filibuster in June.</i>
futilely	In a futile and unproductive manner.

<u>impossible</u>	Used of persons or their behavior. <i>Impossible behavior.</i>
jimmy	To move or force, especially in an effort to get something open. <i>In Britain they call a jimmy and jemmy.</i>
overexertion	Excessive exertion; so much exertion that discomfort or injury results.
pains	An effortful attempt to attain a goal.
practise	Scheme or plot for an evil purpose. <i>He began to practise law.</i>
<u>pry</u>	Be nosey. <i>Raccoons managed to pry the lid off the garbage pail.</i>
<u>reconstruction</u>	The activity of constructing something again. <i>Comparison between the original and the reconstruction.</i>
render	To surrender someone or something to another. <i>The rains rendered his escape impossible.</i>
strenuous	Characterized by or performed with much energy or force. <i>A strenuous task.</i>
strive	To exert much effort or energy. <i>We must strive to secure steady growth.</i>
striving	An effortful attempt to attain a goal.
struggling	Engaged in a struggle to overcome especially poverty or obscurity. <i>A financially struggling theater.</i>
suicide	A person who commits suicide. <i>A suicide blast caused more deaths.</i>
taxing	Physically or mentally demanding. <i>A taxing schedule.</i>
toil	Exhausting physical labour. <i>A life of toil.</i>
travail	(of a woman) be in labour. <i>A woman in travail.</i>
workmanlike	Worthy of a good workman. <i>A steady workmanlike approach.</i>
