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<u>assay</u>	A written report of the results of an analysis of the composition of some substance. They made an assay of the contents.
assiduity	Constant attentions to someone. The assiduity with which he could wear down his opponents.
attempt	Make an effort or attempt. An attempt to halt the bombings.
<u>conscientiously</u>	In a way that is motivated by one's moral sense of right and wrong. <i>He applied himself</i> conscientiously to his profession.
<u>contend</u>	Have an argument about something. Militant groups are contend ing for control of the country.
contribute	Contribute to some cause. <i>He contribute</i> d to a private pension.
effort	A notable achievement. <i>He got an A for effort.</i>
endeavor	Attempt by employing effort. We endeavor to make our customers happy.
endeavour	Earnest, prolonged, and industrious effort. <i>He is endeavouring to help the Third World</i> .
exertion	The application of a force, influence, or quality. They managed only with great exertion .
<u>exhale</u>	Give out (breath or an odor. <i>He exhaled the smoke towards the ceiling.</i>
filibuster	Obstruct proposed legislation with a filibuster. The bill was defeated by a Senate filibuster in June.
futilely	In a futile and unproductive manner.



<u>impossible</u>	Used of persons or their behavior. <i>Impossible</i> behavior.
jimmy	To move or force, especially in an effort to get something open. In Britain they call a jimmy and jemmy.
overexertion	Excessive exertion; so much exertion that discomfort or injury results.
pains	An effortful attempt to attain a goal.
practise	Scheme or plot for an evil purpose. <i>He began to practise law.</i>
pry	Be nosey. Raccoons managed to pry the lid off the garbage pail.
reconstruction	The activity of constructing something again. Comparison between the original and the reconstruction .
render	To surrender someone or something to another. The rains render ed his escape impossible.
strenuous	Characterized by or performed with much energy or force. A strenuous task.
strive	To exert much effort or energy. We must strive to secure steady growth.
striving	An effortful attempt to attain a goal.
struggling	Engaged in a struggle to overcome especially poverty or obscurity. A financially struggling theater.
suicide	A person who commits suicide. A suicide blast caused more deaths.
taxing	Physically or mentally demanding. A taxing schedule.
toil	Exhausting physical labour. A life of toil .
travail	(of a woman) be in labour. A woman in travail .
workmanlike	Worthy of a good workman. A steady workmanlike approach.
