Definitions of "Tryst" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “tryst” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A secret rendezvous (especially between lovers).*
- *A private romantic rendezvous between lovers.*
- *A date; usually with a member of the opposite sex.*

arrangement The act of arranging and adapting a piece of music.
*An intricate **arrangement** of gravel paths.*

assignment	The allocation or attribution of someone or something as belonging to something. <i>His assignment with an older woman.</i>
consultation	A conference between two or more people to consider a particular question. <i>He had a consultation with the judge.</i>
engagement	Employment for performers or performing groups that lasts for a limited period of time. <i>A dinner engagement.</i>
<u>interview</u>	A conversation between a journalist or radio or television presenter and a person of public interest, used as the basis of a broadcast or publication. <i>My interviews with teenagers revealed a weakening of religious bonds.</i>
meeting	A casual or unexpected convergence. <i>We held an urgent meeting to discuss the response to the epidemic.</i>
<u>rendezvous</u>	A meeting place. <i>He was waiting for them at the rendezvous.</i>
<u>session</u>	A period of recording music in a studio especially by a session musician. <i>Gym is followed by a training session.</i>

anonymity	The state of being anonymous. <i>The official spoke on condition of anonymity.</i>
clandestine	Conducted with or marked by hidden aims or methods. <i>She deserved better than these clandestine meetings.</i>
classified	Small advertisements placed in a newspaper and organized in categories. <i>The classified columns of the newspaper.</i>
concealed	Not accessible to view. <i>A concealed weapon.</i>
<u>conclave</u>	The meeting place for a conclave.
<u>confide</u>	Reveal in private tell confidentially. <i>The property of others confided to their care was unjustifiably risked.</i>
<u>confidential</u>	(of information) given in confidence or in secret. <i>He dropped his voice to a confidential whisper.</i>

confidentiality	The state of keeping or being kept secret or private. <i>Visitors have to sign confidentiality agreements.</i>
covert	A feather covering the base of a main flight or tail feather of a bird. <i>It is a good omen when a covert of coots have taken to any particular locality.</i>
enigma	A difficult problem. <i>Madeleine was still an enigma to him.</i>
enigmatic	Difficult to interpret or understand; mysterious. <i>An enigmatic smile.</i>
esoteric	Confined to and understandable by only an enlightened inner circle. <i>Esoteric philosophical debates.</i>
esoterica	Esoteric or highly specialized subjects or publications. <i>A professor of such esoterica as angelology and comparative shamanism.</i>
furtive	Attempting to avoid notice or attention, typically because of guilt or a belief that discovery would lead to trouble; secretive. <i>A furtive manner.</i>
inward	Directed or moving inward or toward a center. <i>Move the needle further inwards.</i>
leakage	The accidental admission or escape of liquid or gas through a hole or crack. <i>We re saving water by reducing leakage.</i>
personal	An advertisement or message in the personal column of a newspaper. <i>He has his personal bank account and she has hers.</i>
privacy	A state in which one is not observed or disturbed by other people. <i>A law to restrict newspapers freedom to invade people s privacy.</i>
private	The lowest rank in the army below lance corporal or private first class. <i>Private lessons.</i>
privy	Hidden; secret. <i>A privy place.</i>
rendezvous	Meet at a rendezvous. <i>I rendezvoused with Bea as planned.</i>
riddle	Speak in riddles. <i>They started asking riddles and telling jokes.</i>
romantic	A person with romantic beliefs or attitudes. <i>A romantic adventure.</i>
secrecy	The action of keeping something secret or the state of being kept secret. <i>The bidding is conducted in secrecy.</i>

secret	Of information given in confidence or in secret. <i>Their secret communications.</i>
<u>stealthy</u>	Behaving or done in a cautious and surreptitious manner, so as not to be seen or heard. <i>Stealthy footsteps.</i>
surreptitious	Marked by quiet and caution and secrecy; taking pains to avoid being observed. <i>Low wages were supplemented by surreptitious payments from tradesmen.</i>
<u>undercover</u>	Conducted with or marked by hidden aims or methods. <i>An undercover police operation.</i>
underhand	Acting or done in a secret or dishonest way. <i>An underhand grip.</i>
underhanded	Marked by deception. <i>Underhanded practices.</i>
