### Definitions of "Tryst" as a noun

<b>consultation</b>	A conference between two or more people to consider a particular question. <i>He had a <b>consultation</b> with the judge.</i>
<b>engagement</b>	Employment for performers or performing groups that lasts for a limited period of time. <i>A dinner <b>engagement</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>interview</u></a>	A conversation between a journalist or radio or television presenter and a person of public interest, used as the basis of a broadcast or publication. <i>My <b>interviews</b> with teenagers revealed a weakening of religious bonds.</i>
<b>meeting</b>	A casual or unexpected convergence. <i>We held an urgent <b>meeting</b> to discuss the response to the epidemic.</i>
<a href="#"><u>rendezvous</u></a>	A meeting place. <i>He was waiting for them at the <b>rendezvous</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>session</u></a>	A period of recording music in a studio especially by a session musician. <i>Gym is followed by a training <b>session</b>.</i>

<b>anonymity</b>	The state of being anonymous. <i>The official spoke on condition of <b>anonymity</b>.</i>
<b>clandestine</b>	Conducted with or marked by hidden aims or methods. <i>She deserved better than these <b>clandestine</b> meetings.</i>
<b>classified</b>	Small advertisements placed in a newspaper and organized in categories. <i>The <b>classified</b> columns of the newspaper.</i>
<b>concealed</b>	Not accessible to view. <i>A <b>concealed</b> weapon.</i>
<a href="#"><u>conclave</u></a>	The meeting place for a conclave.
<a href="#"><u>confide</u></a>	Reveal in private tell confidentially. <i>The property of others <b>confided</b> to their care was unjustifiably risked.</i>

<b>confidentiality</b>	The state of keeping or being kept secret or private. <i>Visitors have to sign <b>confidentiality</b> agreements.</i>
<b>covert</b>	A feather covering the base of a main flight or tail feather of a bird. <i>It is a good omen when a <b>covert</b> of coots have taken to any particular locality.</i>
<b>enigma</b>	A difficult problem. <i>Madeleine was still an <b>enigma</b> to him.</i>
<b>enigmatic</b>	Difficult to interpret or understand; mysterious. <i>An <b>enigmatic</b> smile.</i>
<b>esoteric</b>	Confined to and understandable by only an enlightened inner circle. <i><b>Esoteric</b> philosophical debates.</i>
<b>esoterica</b>	Esoteric or highly specialized subjects or publications. <i>A professor of such <b>esoterica</b> as angelology and comparative shamanism.</i>
<b>furtive</b>	Attempting to avoid notice or attention, typically because of guilt or a belief that discovery would lead to trouble; secretive. <i>A <b>furtive</b> manner.</i>
<b>inward</b>	Directed or moving inward or toward a center. <i>Move the needle further <b>inwards</b>.</i>
<b>leakage</b>	The accidental admission or escape of liquid or gas through a hole or crack. <i>We re saving water by reducing <b>leakage</b>.</i>
<b>personal</b>	An advertisement or message in the personal column of a newspaper. <i>He has his <b>personal</b> bank account and she has hers.</i>
<b>privacy</b>	A state in which one is not observed or disturbed by other people. <i>A law to restrict newspapers freedom to invade people s <b>privacy</b>.</i>
<b>private</b>	The lowest rank in the army below lance corporal or private first class. <i><b>Private</b> lessons.</i>
<b>privy</b>	Hidden; secret. <i>A <b>privy</b> place.</i>
<b>rendezvous</b>	Meet at a rendezvous. <i>I <b>rendezvoused</b> with Bea as planned.</i>
<b>riddle</b>	Speak in riddles. <i>They started asking <b>riddles</b> and telling jokes.</i>
<b>romantic</b>	A person with romantic beliefs or attitudes. <i>A <b>romantic</b> adventure.</i>
<b>secrecy</b>	The action of keeping something secret or the state of being kept secret. <i>The bidding is conducted in <b>secrecy</b>.</i>

<b>secret</b>	Of information given in confidence or in secret. <i>Their <b>secret</b> communications.</i>
<b><u>stealthy</u></b>	Behaving or done in a cautious and surreptitious manner, so as not to be seen or heard. <i><b>Stealthy</b> footsteps.</i>
<b>surreptitious</b>	Marked by quiet and caution and secrecy; taking pains to avoid being observed. <i>Low wages were supplemented by <b>surreptitious</b> payments from tradesmen.</i>
<b><u>undercover</u></b>	Conducted with or marked by hidden aims or methods. <i>An <b>undercover</b> police operation.</i>
<b>underhand</b>	Acting or done in a secret or dishonest way. <i>An <b>underhand</b> grip.</i>
<b>underhanded</b>	Marked by deception. <i><b>Underhanded</b> practices.</i>
