<u>adversity</u>	A stroke of ill fortune; a calamitous event. Debt ridden farmers struggling with adversity .
<u>aftermath</u>	New grass growing after mowing or harvest. The aftermath of war.
aftershock	A tremor (or one of a series of tremors) occurring after the main shock of an earthquake.
aid	Promote or encourage (something. 700 000 tons of food aid .
befall	Happen, occur, or be the case in the course of events or by chance (Santayana. <i>He promised that no harm would befall her.</i>
betide	Become of; happen to. I waited with beating heart not knowing what would betide .
<u>calamity</u>	An event resulting in great loss and misfortune. The journey had led to calamity and ruin.
cataclysm	A sudden violent change in the earth's surface. The cataclysm of the First World War.
catastrophe	Something very unfortunate or unsuccessful. The tax would be a catastrophe for the industry.
cloudburst	A heavy rain.
destruction	A group of wild cats. The destruction of the rainforest.
<u>devastating</u>	Physically or spiritually devastating often used in combination. A devastating portrait of human folly.
devastation	The feeling of being confounded or overwhelmed. <i>Her departure left him in utter devastation.</i>



disaster	A sudden accident or a natural catastrophe that causes great damage or loss of life. A string of personal disaster s.
disruption	A disorderly outburst or tumult. There had been no delays or disruption s to flights.
<u>earthquake</u>	A sudden violent shaking of the ground, typically causing great destruction, as a result of movements within the earth's crust or volcanic action. <i>A political earthquake</i> .
<u>epicenter</u>	The point on the Earth's surface directly above the focus of an earthquake.
flood	Become covered or submerged by a flood. Flood s of tourists come each year to marvel at the sights.
floodplain	An area of low-lying ground adjacent to a river, formed mainly of river sediments and subject to flooding.
flowage	Gradual internal motion or deformation of a solid body (as by heat. Many campsites were located near the flowage .
freshet	The flood of a river from heavy rain or melted snow.
<u>impending</u>	Close in time; about to occur. A fortune teller with dire warnings about impending doom.
inundate	Flood. The basement was inundate d after the storm.
inundation	Flooding. Areas were at risk of inundation .
<u>misfortune</u>	Bad luck. Never laugh at other people s misfortune s.
overflow	Overflow with a certain feeling. There was some overflow after heavy rainfall.
seismic	Subject to or caused by an earthquake or earth vibration. After a few days of seismic activity the volcanic eruption started.
seismograph	A measuring instrument for detecting and measuring the intensity and direction and duration of movements of the ground (as an earthquake.
<u>torrent</u>	A heavy rain. The houses were swept away in the torrent .
tragedy	An event resulting in great loss and misfortune. <i>His life had been plagued by tragedy.</i>
