**neoplasm** An abnormal new mass of tissue that serves no purpose.  
*Carcinoma of the cervix is a common **neoplasm** in women.*

**tumour** A swelling of a part of the body, generally without inflammation, caused by an abnormal growth of tissue, whether benign or malignant.

<b>anticancer</b>	Used in the treatment of cancer. <i>New <b>anticancer</b> therapies.</i>
<b>axon</b>	Long nerve fiber that conducts away from the cell body of the neuron.
<b>brain</b>	The brain of certain animals used as meat. <i>Success requires <b>brain</b> as well as brawn.</i>
<b>bruise</b>	Inflict a bruise or bruises on a part of the body. <i>The customer <b>bruised</b> the strawberries by squeezing them.</i>
<a href="#"><u>cell</u></a>	The local area covered by one of the short range transmitters in a cellular telephone system. <i>The <b>cells</b> of a honeycomb.</i>
<a href="#"><u>cerebral</u></a>	Of the cerebrum of the brain. <i><b>Cerebral</b> drama.</i>
<b>cerebrum</b>	The principal and most anterior part of the brain in vertebrates, located in the front area of the skull and consisting of two hemispheres, left and right, separated by a fissure. It is responsible for the integration of complex sensory and neural functions and the initiation and coordination of voluntary activity in the body.
<b>concussion</b>	Temporary unconsciousness or confusion caused by a blow on the head. <i>He was carried off the pitch with <b>concussion</b>.</i>
<b>cortex</b>	An outer layer of another organ or body part such as a kidney the renal cortex the cerebellum or a hair.
<b>cortical</b>	Relating to the outer layer of the cerebrum. <i>The imaging of the brain showed <b>cortical</b> atrophy.</i>
<b>cranial</b>	Of or relating to the cranium which encloses the brain.
<b>cranium</b>	The part of the skull that encloses the brain.
<b>cystic</b>	Of or relating to or resembling a cyst. <i>The <b>cystic</b> stage.</i>
<a href="#"><u>furrow</u></a>	Hollow out in the form of a furrow or groove. <i>John s face was <b>furrowed</b> with tears.</i>
<b>germ</b>	A portion of an organism capable of developing into a new one or part of one. <i>The <b>germ</b> of a brilliant idea.</i>
<b>lesion</b>	Any localized abnormal structural change in a bodily part.
<b>malignant</b>	Evil in nature or effect; malevolent. <i>In the hands of <b>malignant</b> fate.</i>

<b>necrosis</b>	The death of most or all of the cells in an organ or tissue due to disease, injury, or failure of the blood supply.
<b>neural</b>	Of or relating to the nervous system. <i>Patterns of <b>neural</b> activity.</i>
<b>neuron</b>	A cell that is specialized to conduct nerve impulses.
<b>neurophysiology</b>	The branch of neuroscience that studies the physiology of the nervous system.
<b>neuroscientist</b>	A neurobiologist who specializes in the study of the brain. <i>There is a significant and growing need among <b>neuroscientists</b> to exchange experimental data.</i>
<b>parietal</b>	Of the parietal lobe. <i><b>Parietal</b> rules.</i>
<b>pituitary</b>	Of or relating to the pituitary gland.
<b>postmortem</b>	An examination and dissection of a dead body to determine cause of death or the changes produced by disease. <i><b>Postmortem</b> changes.</i>
<b>skull</b>	A bone framework enclosing the brain of a vertebrate; the skeleton of a person's or animal's head. <i>My waking came in drugged stages I had been <b>skulled</b>.</i>
<b>stratagem</b>	A plan or scheme, especially one used to outwit an opponent or achieve an end. <i>A series of devious <b>stratagems</b>.</i>
<b>synapse</b>	The junction between two neurons (axon-to-dendrite) or between a neuron and a muscle. <i>Nerve impulses cross a <b>synapse</b> through the action of neurotransmitters.</i>
<b>tactician</b>	A person who uses a carefully planned strategy to achieve a specific end. <i>A brilliant political <b>tactician</b>.</i>
<b>vascular</b>	Relating to or denoting the plant tissues (xylem and phloem) which conduct water, sap, and nutrients in flowering plants, ferns, and their relatives. <i>The <b>vascular</b> system.</i>
