Definitions of "Tunnel" as a noun

- A hole made by an animal, usually for shelter.
- A passageway through or under something, usually underground (especially one for trains or cars.
- A long, half-cylindrical enclosure used to protect plants, made of clear plastic stretched over hoops.
- A passage in a sports stadium by which players enter or leave the field.
- An artificial underground passage, especially one built through a hill or under a building, road, or river.
- An underground passage dug by a burrowing animal.





Synonyms of "Tunnel" as a noun (2 Words)


burrow

A hole or tunnel dug by a small animal, especially a rabbit, as a dwelling.

underground passage

An electric railway operating below the surface of the ground (usually in a city.






Usage Examples of "Tunnel" as a noun

- A road tunnel through the Pyrenees.
- The tunnel mouth.
- He jogged off the field and into the tunnel.
- Cover plants in rows with a cloche tunnel.





Tunnel as a Verb

Definitions of "Tunnel" as a verb

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "tunnel" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- (of a particle) pass through a potential barrier.
- Dig or force a passage underground or through something.
- Force a way through.
- Move through by or as by digging.





Synonyms of "Tunnel" as a verb (3 Words)

Make a thorough inquiry; investigate. **burrow**

dig one's way Remove, harvest, or recover by digging.
