Associations of "Turn into" (30 Words)

anticlockwise	In the direction opposite to the rotation of the hands of a clock. <i>An anticlockwise direction.</i>
bend	A kind of knot used to join two ropes together or to tie a rope to another object e g a carrick bend. <i>A bend in the river.</i>
<u>bent</u>	Sharply curved or having an angle. <i>Bent on going to the theater.</i>
crimp	A small connecting piece for crimping wires or lines together. <i>Crimp hair.</i>
<u>curve</u>	Form a curl curve or kink. <i>Her dress twisted tightly round her generous curves.</i>
<u>deviate</u>	A person whose behavior deviates from what is acceptable especially in sexual behavior. <i>You must not deviate from the agreed route.</i>
<u>distorted</u>	Giving a misleading or false account or impression; misrepresented. <i>Distorted guitars.</i>
<u>flip</u>	Glib or flippant. <i>A flip answer to serious question.</i>
garble	A garbled account or transmission. <i>Upon winning a race a driver spews out a litany of commercial garble.</i>
kink	Form a curl curve or kink. <i>A kink in the road.</i>
<u>pervert</u>	Corrupt morally or by intemperance or sensuality. <i>He was charged with conspiring to pervert the course of justice.</i>
<u>revolve</u>	Move in a circle on a central axis. <i>Their whole lives revolved around the company.</i>

rotate	Change the position of (tyres) on a motor vehicle to distribute wear. <i>The job of chairing the meeting rotates.</i>
rotation	The passing of a privilege or responsibility to each member of a group in a regularly recurring order. <i>It has become common for senior academics to act as heads of department in rotation.</i>
slew	Of an electronic device undergo slewing. <i>I was assaulted by the thump and slew of the van.</i>
somersault	Perform a somersault or make a similar movement accidentally. <i>Paula's stomach turned a somersault.</i>
spin	Spin dry clothes. <i>A spin around town.</i>
spiraling	In the shape of a coil.
swerve	The act of turning aside suddenly. <i>Do not make sudden swerves particularly around parked vehicles.</i>
swivel	Turn around a point or axis or on a swivel. <i>She swivelled her eyes round.</i>
twist	The act of winding or twisting. <i>Barrels with a 1 24 inch twist.</i>
twisted	Forced out of its natural or proper shape; crumpled. <i>The crash left a trail of twisted metal across the carriageway.</i>
veer	Change direction suddenly. <i>The conversation eventually veered away from theatrical things.</i>
warped	Bent or twisted out of shape, typically as a result of the effects of heat or damp. <i>The floors were warped and cracked.</i>
whirl	Fly around. <i>He was caught up in a whirl of work.</i>
wind	A scent carried by the wind indicating the presence or proximity of an animal or person. <i>Wind players.</i>
winding	The act of winding or twisting. <i>Winding roads are full of surprises.</i>
worm	The threaded cylinder in a worm gear. <i>She ate so much so often that I thought she had worms.</i>
wrench	Turn something especially a nut or bolt with a wrench. <i>You will need a wrench to tighten it in position.</i>
