Associations of "Turn on" (30 Words)

anticlockwise	(of a direction) opposite to the way in which the hands of a clock move round. <i>Stopcocks are opened by turning them anticlockwise.</i>
bend	Bend a joint. <i>We cannot bend the rules even for Darren.</i>
bent	An area of grassland unbounded by fences or hedges. <i>A man of a religious bent.</i>
crimp	A small connecting piece for crimping wires or lines together. <i>Pliers will crimp wires together.</i>
curve	A pitch of a baseball that is thrown with spin so that its path curves as it approaches the batter. <i>The parapet wall sweeps down in a bold curve.</i>
deviate	A person whose behavior deviates from what is acceptable especially in sexual behavior. <i>The river was deviated to prevent flooding.</i>
distorted	Affected by electrical distortion. <i>His report gives a distorted view of the meeting.</i>
flip	The act of flipping a coin. <i>Given those odds one might as well flip a coin.</i>
garble	A garbled account or transmission. <i>Most readers assumed the word was a typographical garble.</i>
kink	Form a curl curve or kink. <i>Take care to avoid kinking the wire.</i>
pervert	A person whose sexual behaviour is regarded as abnormal and unacceptable. <i>He was charged with conspiring to pervert the course of justice.</i>
revolve	Consider (something) repeatedly and from different angles. <i>Her mind revolved the possibilities.</i>

rotate	Change the position of (tyres) on a motor vehicle to distribute wear. <i>Ballet dancers can rotate their legs out by 90 degrees.</i>
rotation	A transformation in which the coordinate axes are rotated by a fixed angle about the origin. <i>The manager had only four starting pitchers in his rotation.</i>
slew	Of an electronic device undergo slewing. <i>I was assaulted by the thump and slew of the van.</i>
somersault	Perform a somersault or make a similar movement accidentally. <i>A backward somersault.</i>
spin	Fish with a spinner. <i>Spiders spin a fine web.</i>
spiraling	In the shape of a coil.
swerve	Change or cause to change direction abruptly. <i>Do not make sudden swerves particularly around parked vehicles.</i>
swivel	Turn around a point or axis or on a swivel. <i>He swivelled in the chair.</i>
twist	A hairdo formed by braiding or twisting the hair. <i>Lets do the twist.</i>
twisted	(of a joint) injured by wrenching; sprained. <i>A man with a twisted mind.</i>
veer	A sudden change of direction. <i>An oil tanker that had veered off course.</i>
warped	Used especially of timbers or boards; bent out of shape usually by moisture. <i>Warped wooden planks.</i>
whirl	Move or cause to move rapidly round and round. <i>The event was all part of the mad social whirl.</i>
wind	Make a baby bring up wind after feeding by patting its back. <i>An easterly wind.</i>
winding	The act of winding or twisting. <i>Our bedroom was at the top of a winding staircase.</i>
worm	Screw thread on a gear with the teeth of a worm wheel or rack. <i>It was unbearable that such a worm could be so successful.</i>
wrench	Turn something especially a nut or bolt with a wrench. <i>It will be a real wrench to leave after eight years.</i>
wrest	Forcibly pull (something) from a person's grasp. <i>Wrest power from the old government.</i>
