## Associations of "Turnabout is fair play" (30 Words)

<b>balanced</b>	Taking everything into account; fairly judged or presented. <i>She assembled a <b>balanced</b> team.</i>
<b><u>coincidence</u></b>	The fact of corresponding in nature or in time of occurrence. <i>The interval determining the <b>coincidence</b> gate is adjustable.</i>
<b>concurrent</b>	(of two or more prison sentences) to be served at the same time. <i>He received <b>concurrent</b> sentences of two years imprisonment for each of his two convictions.</i>
<b><u>counterbalance</u></b>	A weight that balances another weight. <i>The sitter s weight <b>counterbalances</b> the tilting pressure on the backrest.</i>
<b><u>decent</u></b>	Decently clothed. <i>People need <b>decent</b> homes.</i>
<b>disinterested</b>	Unaffected by self-interest. <i>Her father was so <b>disinterested</b> in her progress that he only visited the school once.</i>
<b>dispassion</b>	Objectivity and detachment. <i>Her manner assumed a <b>dispassion</b> and dryness very unlike her usual tone.</i>
<b>equal</b>	Be equal to in quality or ability. <i>His work is concerned with why private property <b>equals</b> exploitation.</i>
<b><u>equalize</u></b>	Make uniform in application or effect. <i>Morgan <b>equalized</b> ten minutes into the second half.</i>
<b><u>equally</u></b>	In the same manner or to the same extent. <i>Deal <b>equally</b> with rich and poor.</i>
<b>equipoise</b>	Balance of forces or interests. <i>Capital flows act as an <b>equipoise</b> to international imbalances in savings.</i>
<b>equitable</b>	Fair to all parties as dictated by reason and conscience. <i>The <b>equitable</b> distribution of resources.</i>

<b>equity</b>	The difference between the market value of a property and the claims held against it. <i>He owns 62 of the group s <b>equity</b>.</i>
<b>evenhanded</b>	Without partiality. <i><b>Evenhanded</b> justice.</i>
<b>hap</b>	An accidental happening. <i>He recorded all the little <b>haps</b> and <b>mishaps</b> of his life.</i>
<b>happenstance</b>	An event that might have been arranged although it was really accidental. <i>It was just <b>happenstance</b> that I happened to be there.</i>
<b>honest</b>	Free of deceit; truthful and sincere. <i><b>Honest</b> lawyers.</i>
<b>impartial</b>	Free from undue bias or preconceived opinions. <i>The <b>impartial</b> eye of a scientist.</i>
<b>justice</b>	A public official authorized to decide questions brought before a court of justice. <i>The <b>justice</b> of his case.</i>
<b>outspoken</b>	Characterized by directness in manner or speech; without subtlety or evasion. <i>It is possible to be <b>outspoken</b> without being rude.</i>
<b>righteousness</b>	The quality of being morally right or justifiable. <i>We had little doubt about the <b>righteousness</b> of our cause.</i>
<b>same</b>	Similarly in the same way. <i>This road is the <b>same</b> one we were on yesterday.</i>
<b>sportsmanship</b>	Fair and generous behaviour or treatment of others, especially in a sporting contest. <i>He displayed great <b>sportsmanship</b> in defeat.</i>
<b>straightness</b>	Having honest intentions.
<b>symmetrical</b>	Having similarity in size, shape, and relative position of corresponding parts. <i>The shape of a hill smooth and <b>symmetrical</b>.</i>
<b>truthful</b>	Conforming to truth. <i>A <b>truthful</b> person.</i>
<b>unbiased</b>	Characterized by a lack of partiality. <i>An <b>unbiased</b> account of her family problems.</i>
<b>unprejudiced</b>	Not having or showing a dislike or distrust based on fixed or preconceived ideas. <i>An <b>unprejudiced</b> reading of the New Testament.</i>

**unpretentious** Exhibiting restrained good taste.  
*In spite of his fame he was thoroughly **unpretentious**.*

**veracious** Precisely accurate.  
*A **veracious** account.*
