Associations of "Turning a blind eye" (30 Words)

askance	Directed to one side with or as if with doubt or suspicion or envy-Elizabeth Bowen. <i>Her eyes with their misted askance look.</i>
behold	See or observe (someone or something, especially of remarkable or impressive nature). <i>Behold Christ.</i>
binoculars	An optical instrument designed for simultaneous use by both eyes.
blindly	Without preparation or reflection; without a rational basis. <i>She began groping blindly in the dark.</i>
blink	Try to control or prevent tears by blinking. <i>Out on the marshes there was a blink of light.</i>
blinking	Used to express annoyance. <i>I ll sign off however I blinking well like.</i>
chauvinism	Activity indicative of belief in the superiority of men over women. <i>There is very little national chauvinism in the country today.</i>
crippled	Severely damaged or malfunctioning. <i>His rule left the country with a crippled economy.</i>
eyelid	Each of the upper and lower folds of skin which cover the eye when closed.
eyesight	A person’s ability to see. <i>Poor eyesight ended his plans for a naval career.</i>
flicker	Shine unsteadily. <i>Amusement flickered briefly in his eyes.</i>
gaze	(in literary theory) a particular perspective considered as embodying certain aspects of the relationship between observer and observed. <i>Offices screened from the public gaze.</i>

leer	Look or gaze in a lascivious or unpleasant way. <i>Bystanders were leering at the nude painting.</i>
macroscopic	Large enough to be visible with the naked eye.
ocular	Visible- Shakespeare. Ocular inspection.
oculist	A medical doctor specializing in the diagnosis and treatment of diseases of the eye. <i>He visited an oculist in Chicago who prescribed a pair of reading glasses.</i>
optic	A lens or other optical component in an optical instrument. <i>The optic or optical axis of the eye.</i>
seeing	The action of seeing someone or something. <i>He had given the seeing as fair.</i>
shortsightedness	(ophthalmology) eyesight abnormality resulting from the eye's faulty refractive ability; distant objects appear blurred.
sidelong	Directed to or from one side. <i>Darting eyes looking sidelong out of a wizened face.</i>
sight	Adjust the sight of a firearm or optical instrument. <i>She offered to show me the sights.</i>
sightless	Invisible. <i>Blank sightless eyes.</i>
squint	Be cross eyed have a squint or strabismus. <i>The bright sun made them squint.</i>
stare	Fixate one's eyes. <i>He looked away pretending to stare out of the window.</i>
telescopic	Capable of viewing and magnifying distant objects. <i>A telescopic umbrella.</i>
unnamed	Being or having an unknown or unnamed source. <i>An unnamed donor.</i>
vision	The images seen on a television screen. <i>He had a vision of the Virgin Mary.</i>
visual	Visible. Visual navigation.
watch	See or watch. <i>He told me my telephones were tapped and that I was being watched.</i>
wink	An act of winking. <i>The diamond on her finger winked in the moonlight.</i>
